TOP THINGS TO DO

- **Ærøskøbing Old Town Walk** — Wander Brogade and its side alleys, lined with half-timbered houses from the 1600s–1700s.
- **Island Cycle Route** — Rent a bike at the tender dock and pedal coastal paths through rolling fields and thatched villages.
- **Marstal Maritime Museum** — Denmark's premier small-ship maritime museum spans 37 exhibits across five buildings and traces Marstal's seafaring...
- **Voderup Klint Coastal Cliffs** — Unique 'stepped' moraine cliffs on the island's southwest coast drop dramatically to the sea.
- **Skjoldnæs Lighthouse** — Built in 1881 from cut Bornholm granite at the island's northern tip near Søby, this 22-metre lighthouse is a landmark...

BEST WALKS

- **Ærøskøbing Historic Centre Loop** 1.5 km · 30-45 min · Easy — From the harbour quay, follow Søndergade into the old town, turn onto Brogade for the best-preserved merchant houses, continue past...
- **Ærøskøbing Beach Huts Walk** 2 km round-trip · 40 min · Easy — Head west from the tender quay along the waterfront to Vesterstrand beach, where rows of colourful painted beach huts line the shore...

KNOW BEFORE YOU GO

- Mind the tender queue. With a short ship's day, get on an early tender — the return queue can build up in the late afternoon.
- The bus really is free. The island's tourist bus costs nothing and runs hourly between Søby, Ærøskøbing, and Marstal — it's the easiest way to reach Marstal without renting a bike.
- Cards accepted almost everywhere. Denmark is nearly cashless — you rarely need Danish Krone, though a few market stalls
