- **Godafoss & Lake Myvatn** — Iceland's 'Waterfall of the Gods' cascades in a dramatic horseshoe arc, then it's on to the otherworldly Lake Myvatn...
- **Whale Watching from Akureyri** — Eyjafjörður is one of Iceland's best whale-watching fjords.
- **Myvatn Nature Baths** — Soak in geothermal mineral-rich waters with a backdrop of volcanic highlands — Myvatn's answer to the Blue Lagoon, but...
- **Hrisey Island Ferry & Village** — A short ferry hop takes you to tiny Hrisey, the 'Pearl of Eyjafjörður' — a tranquil fishing village known for its...

BEST WALKS

- **Pier to Akureyrarkirkja & Town** ~1.5 km · 1 hr · easy — Walk off the pier along Hafnarstræti, the buzzing main street, then climb the 112 steps to Akureyrarkirkja — the striking...
- **Lystigardurinn Botanical Garden** ~2 km · 1.5 hrs · easy — The world's most northerly botanical garden (66°N) has been blooming since 1912.
- **Christmas Garden (Jólagarðurinn)** ~10 min drive · 1.5 hrs · easy — Akureyri is Iceland's Christmas-obsessed town — even its traffic lights are heart-shaped.

KNOW BEFORE YOU GO

- Cards accepted everywhere. Iceland is nearly cashless — your contactless card works in cafés, tours, and gift shops without needing ISK in your pocket.
- Layer up, even in summer. Akureyri is warmer than Reykjavik but the fjord wind is real. A waterproof jacket and warm mid-layer are essentials year-round.
