GETTING ASHORE

Docking: Ships dock at Sanderson Bay wharf — no tendering required

Best For: WWII history, traditional sing-sing performances, local markets

Walk to center: ~15-20 min walk or short taxi ride to Alotau Market

Don't Miss: Alotau War Memorial Park and a dockside sing-sing welcome dance

 Getting around:  **Taxi**  ~PGK 10 / AUD \$5 each way to town; negotiate longer trips

TOP THINGS TO DO

- **Traditional Sing-Sing Performance** — Watch elaborately costumed village groups perform traditional dances, drumming, and chanting — one of the most striking...
- **Alotau War Memorial Park & WWII Sites** — The Battle of Milne Bay in 1942 was the first Allied land defeat of Japanese forces in WWII.
- **Alotau Market & Town Walk** — Dive into daily life at the bustling Alotau Market near the pier — fresh tropical fruit, seafood, carved wooden masks...
- **Snorkeling in Milne Bay** — Milne Bay's warm, calm waters shelter over 850 fish species and healthy coral reefs.
- **Milne Bay Village Life Visit** — Small-group tours to nearby villages offer clay-pot cooking demonstrations, traditional craft making, and a genuine...

BEST WALKS

- **Wharf to Alotau Market Loop** 1.5 km one-way · 20 min · Easy — Walk from the Sanderson Bay wharf through the commercial strip to the Alotau Town Main Market.
- **War Memorial Park Stroll** ~2 km round trip · 30-40 min · Easy — From the town center, walk to the Alotau War Memorial Park with its black granite monument commemorating the Battle of Milne Bay.

KNOW BEFORE YOU GO

- **Bring Kina:** The Papua New Guinean Kina is the only reliable currency. Some vendors take AUD or USD but at poor rates. Draw cash from the port ATM early — it can run dry on cruise...
Dress modestly. Shoulders and knees covered are expected, especially in villages. Light, loose-fitting clothes are both culturally
