GETTING ASHORE

Docking: Direct dock at Bangor Landing on the Penobscot River — no tender required

Best For: Stephen King fans, history buffs, nature walks, Acadia day-trippers

Walk to center: 5-10 min stroll from the pier to downtown shops and restaurants

Don't Miss: The 31-ft Paul Bunyan statue and a walk past Stephen King's West Broadway home

Getting around: Taxi \$5–\$15 · Rideshare Uber, Lyft

TOP THINGS TO DO

- Stephen King's Bangor Tour** — Bangor is King's real-life home and the inspiration for the fictional town of Derry.
- Fort Knox & Penobscot Narrows Observatory** — One of Maine's best-preserved Civil War-era granite forts sits 25 miles south on the Penobscot River.
- Acadia National Park Day-Trip** — Bar Harbor and Acadia are an hour east and the classic Maine cruise day-trip.
- Cole Land Transportation Museum** — More than 200 antique vehicles — trucks, cars, military equipment, and snowplows — fill this well-curated Bangor museum.
- Orono Bog Boardwalk** — A 1-mile accessible loop boardwalk through a living peat bog just outside the city — pitcher plants, sundews, and rare...

BEST WALKS

- Waterfront to Paul Bunyan Statue** 1.5 miles | ~30 min | Easy | Flat — Walk north along the Penobscot River waterfront path from Bangor Landing, then cut up Main Street into downtown.
- Downtown Historic District Stroll** 1 mile loop | ~25 min | Easy | Flat — Circle through Bangor's handsome 19th-century downtown: the Bangor Opera House (Art Deco façade), the Zillman Art Museum at the...

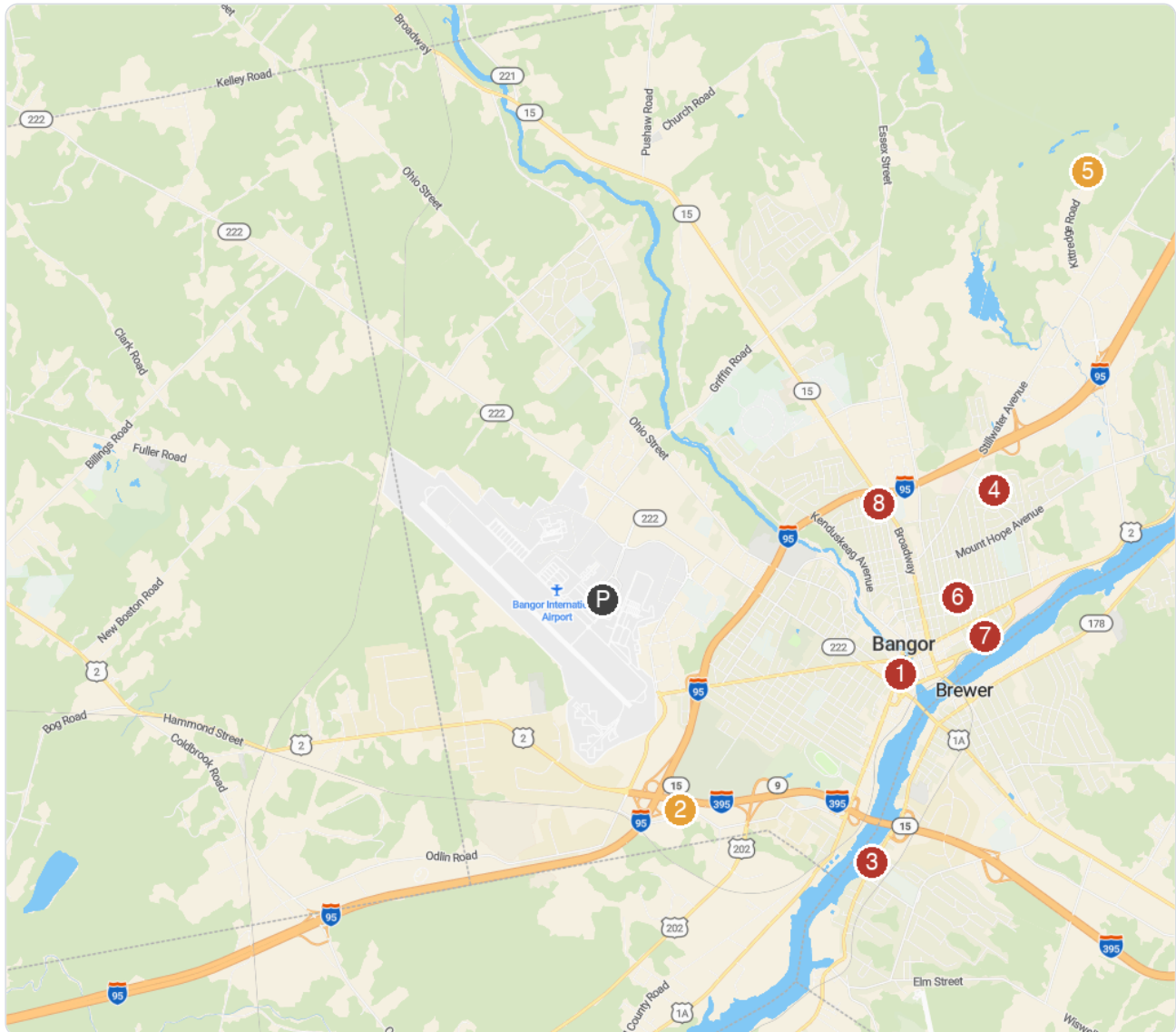
KNOW BEFORE YOU GO

- Small ships only. Bangor Landing is a river pier for American Cruise Lines-style vessels (150-200 passengers). Large ocean cruise ships do not call here.
- Rent a car for Acadia. The national park is the biggest draw, but there's no direct public transit from Bangor. Book a car in advance
