

Bourg-sur-Gironde, Nouvelle-Aquitaine, France

Perched on the Dordogne just above its confluence with the Garonne, Bourg-sur-Gironde packs two millennia of history into a single limestone hillside — citadel ruins, troglodyte caves, and Côtes de Bourg vineyards all within a short walk of the pontoon.

GETTING ASHORE

Docking: Quai Jean Bart pontoon, ~300 m from town center

TOP THINGS TO DO

- **Citadel & Musée des Calèches** — Explore the ruined citadel on its rocky promontory above the estuary.
- **Estuary Cruise — Carrelets & Cliffs** — Board a small local boat (e.g., Clapotine) for a guided trip onto the Dordogne and Gironde estuary.
- **Côtes de Bourg Wine Tasting** — Bourg is the capital of the Côtes de Bourg appellation.
- **Blaye Citadel Day Trip** — A 20-minute drive across the estuary (ferry from Blaye or road via Bordeaux), the Blaye Citadel is a UNESCO World...
- **Route de la Corniche Fleurie** — The scenic cliff road between Bourg and Villeneuve winds past troglodyte dwellings, traditional carrelets, and...

BEST WALKS

- **Ville Basse to Citadel Loop** 2 km · 45–60 min · Easy/Moderate — From the pontoon, walk through the lower town past the covered washhouse, through Porte Batailleyre, then climb the Escalier du Roy to...
- **Corniche Fleurie Walk** 3 km one-way · 1 hr · Easy — Head south-west out of town along the cliff road toward Villeneuve for views of carrelets and limestone caves.

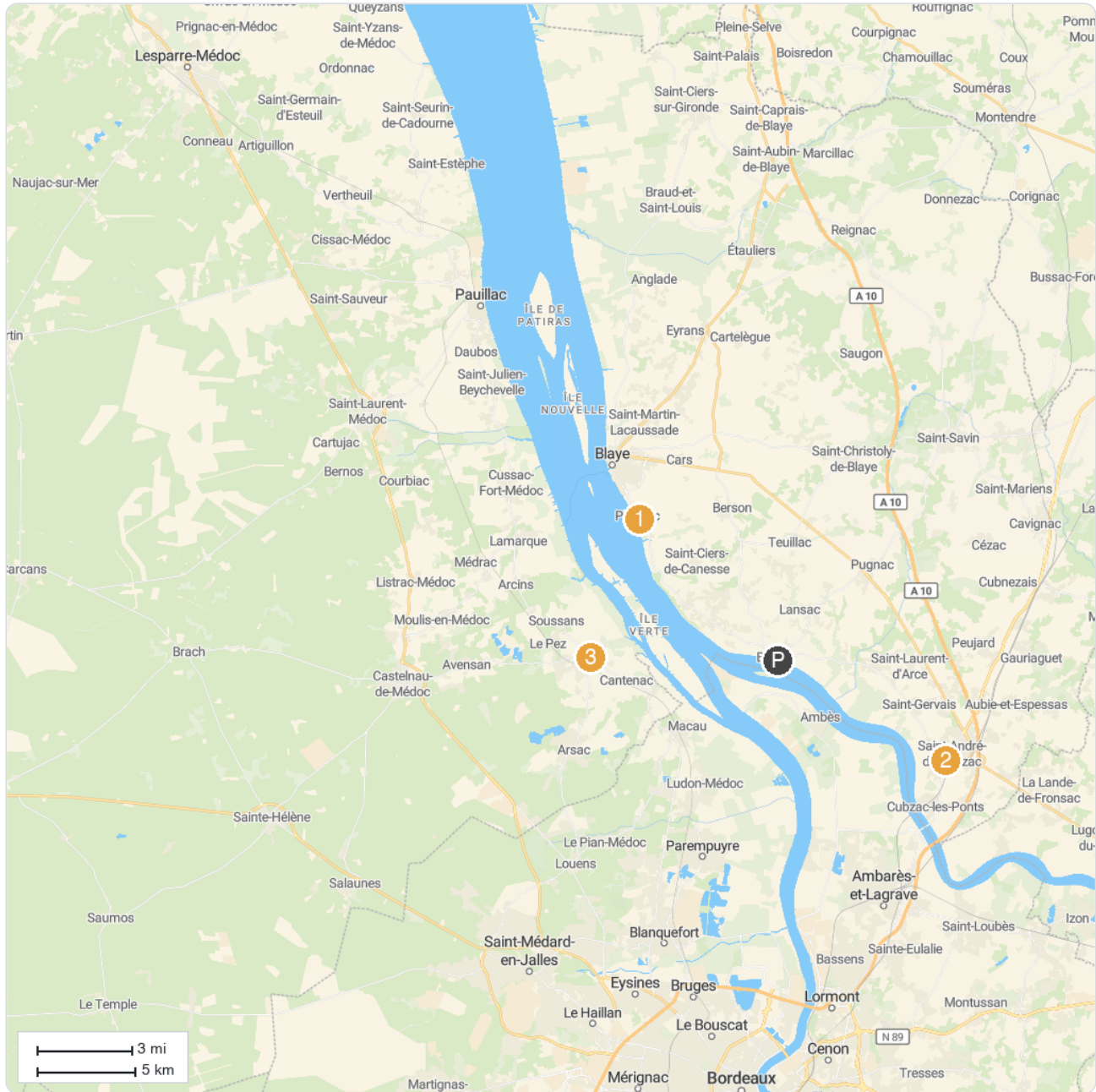

KNOW BEFORE YOU GO

- River ships only. Bourg is a river cruise stop — ships are small (max 135 m) and dock directly on the quay. No tendering, no big-ship crowds.
- Buy wine here. The Maison des Vins des Côtes de Bourg lets you taste before you buy. Prices are noticeably lower than in Saint-Émilion across the estuary.
- Bring walking shoes. The upper town involves a steep climb up the historic Escalier du Roy. Worth it for the panoramic views.
