- **La Boca & Caminito** — The brightly painted tin houses of the Caminito, the immigrant-and-football soul of the city, home to Boca Juniors' La...
- **Parrilla & Wine Tasting** — Argentina on a plate — a proper parrilla feast of asado and bife de chorizo paired with Mendoza Malbec.

- **Recoleta: cemetery & plazas** ~2 km · 1.5 hrs · easy — The elegant Recoleta district — the famous cemetery, the Basílica del Pilar, and the leafy plazas and cafés around Avenida Alvear, the...
- **San Telmo old quarter** ~2 km · 1.5 hrs · easy — Cobble Defensa street from Plaza de Mayo through the antique shops and cafés to Plaza Dorrego, heart of the Sunday market and street...
- **Puerto Madero waterfront** ~2.5 km · 1 hr · easy — The revitalized dockland of converted brick warehouses, the white Puente de la Mujer footbridge, and the Reserva Ecológica nature...

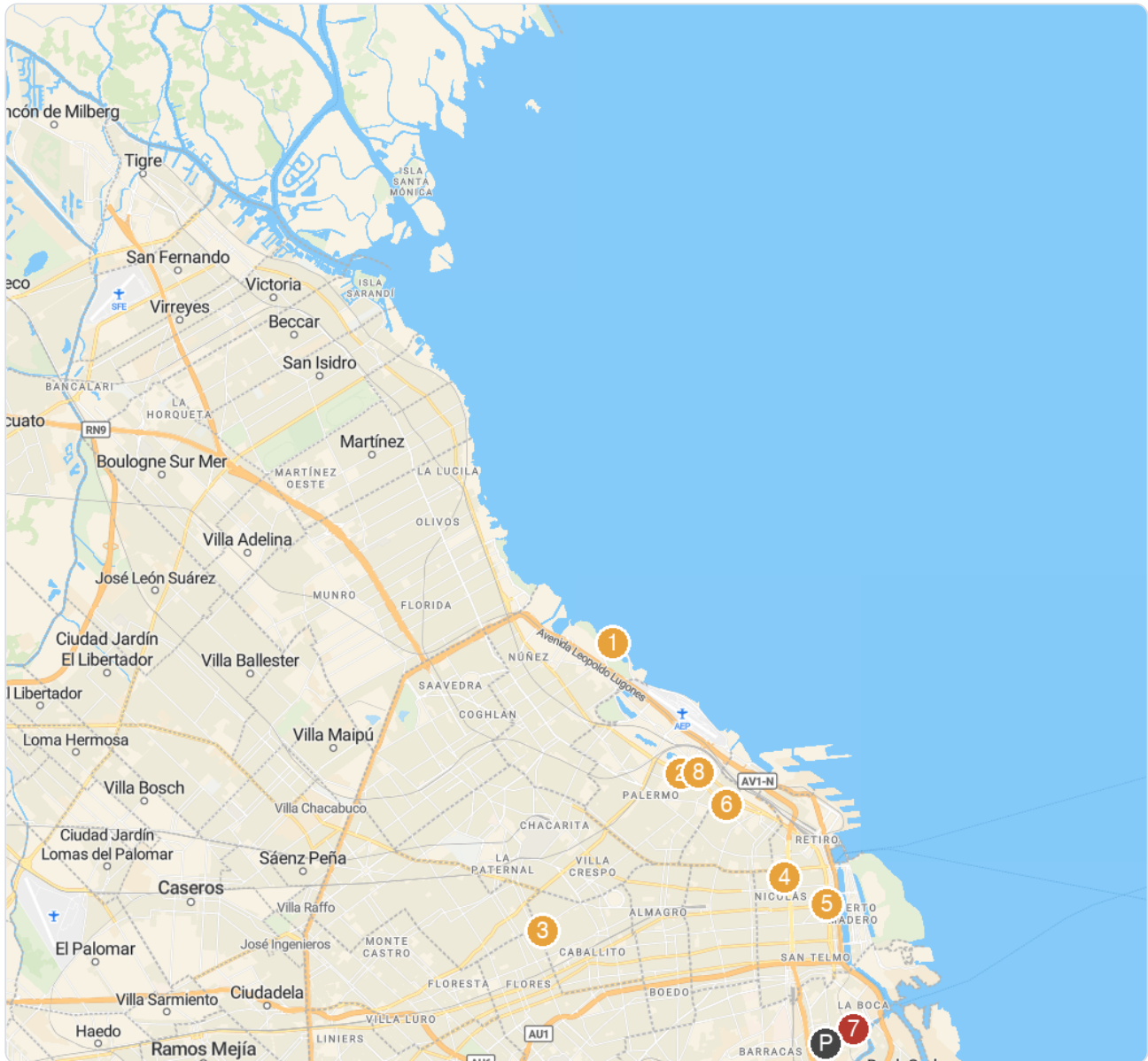
KNOW BEFORE YOU GO
