## GETTING ASHORE

**Docking:** Ships tie up alongside the Rhône riverbank quay; no tender required.

**Best For:** Cycling the ViaRhôna, Rhône wine tasting, and easy Provence day trips.

**Walk to centre:** 5–10 min on foot from the quay into the old village.

**Don't Miss:** The 13th-century ramparts and the nougat shops of Montélimar (9 km).

## TOP THINGS TO DO

- **Grignan Castle & Village** — About twenty-three kilometres east, Grignan hosts the largest Renaissance castle in south-east France — the château of...
- **Montélimar Nougat Tour** — The nougat capital of France is just 9 km south.
- **ViaRhôna Cycling** — Jump on a bike and join the ViaRhôna, an 815 km motor-free trail from Lake Geneva to the Mediterranean.
- **Gorges de l'Ardèche Day Trip** — About 30 km west, the Ardèche Gorges carve through 300-metre limestone cliffs.
- **Orange Roman Theatre** — One of the world's best-preserved Roman theatres — a UNESCO World Heritage site — stands in Orange, roughly 40 km south.

## BEST WALKS

- **Old Village & Ramparts Loop** 1.5 km · 30–45 min · Easy — From the quay, walk up to the old village entrance and follow the medieval lanes past the Church of Saint-Nicolas.
- **ViaRhôna Riverside Walk** 2–5 km · 45 min–1.5 hrs · Easy, flat — Head south along the ViaRhôna path hugging the Rhône riverbank.

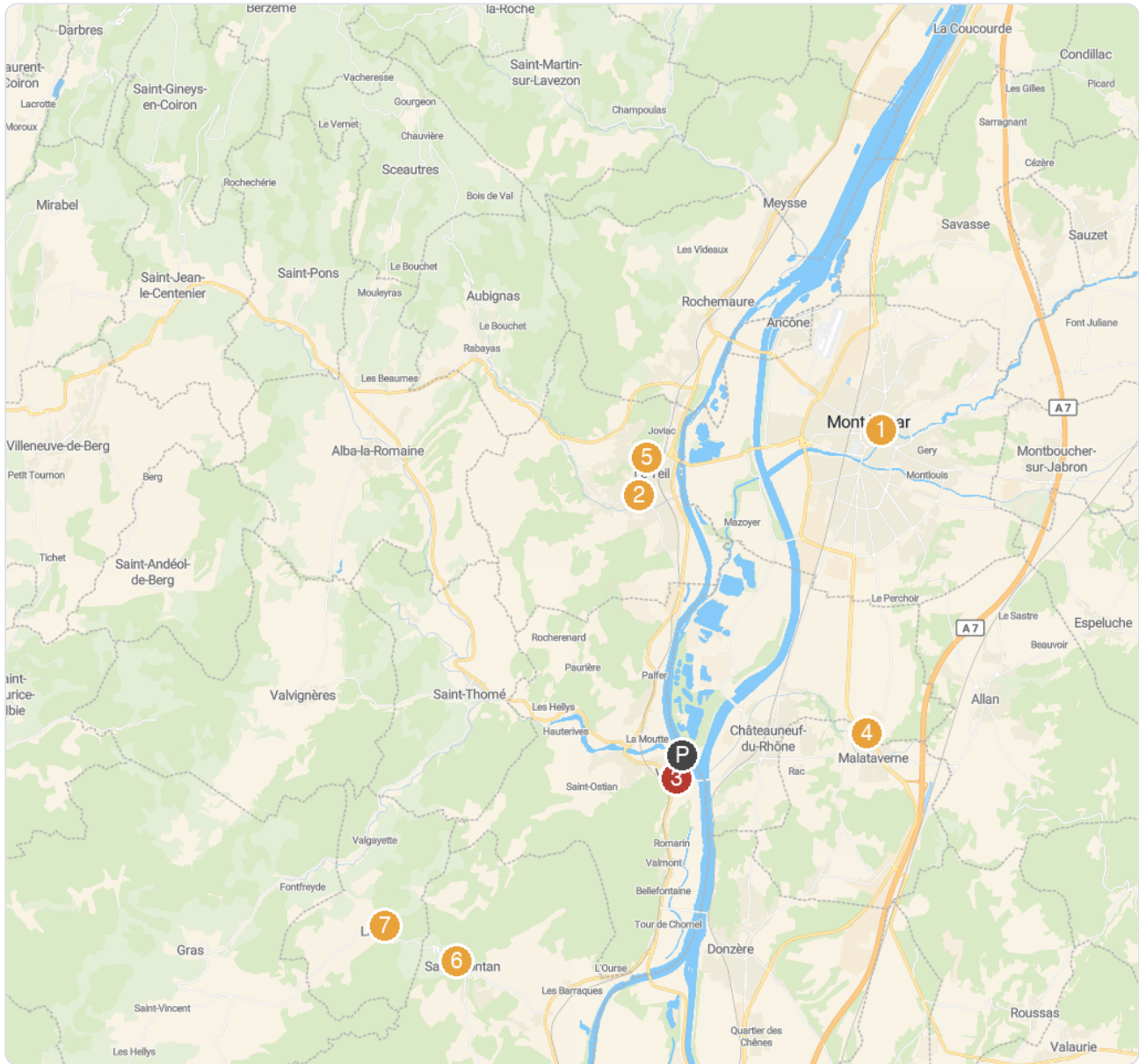
## KNOW BEFORE YOU GO
