GETTING ASHORE

Docking: Pier — ships dock at Terminal Puerto Coquimbo; shuttle bus to exit gate

Best For: Seafood, colonial history, Elqui Valley pisco tours, beaches

Walk to center: 5 min from gate to Caleta fish market; La Serena 20 min by taxi

Don't Miss: Caleta sea lions, Cruz del Tercer Milenio elevator views, pastel de jaiba crab casserole

- **Elqui Valley Pisco Tour** — Drive into the world's clearest-sky valley, visit a pisco distillery, and taste Chile's national spirit amid Andean...
- **Cruz del Tercer Milenio & Coquimbo City** — Ride an elevator inside South America's tallest monument — the 93-metre concrete Cruz del Tercer Milenio — for...
- **La Serena Colonial City Walk** — Chile's second-oldest city is a 20-minute taxi ride away.
- **Avenida del Mar Beach Walk** — The sweeping coastal avenue connects Coquimbo to La Serena along miles of white sand.
- **Caleta Fish Market & Seafood Lunch** — Walk five minutes from the port gate to Coquimbo's waterfront Caleta — where pelicans and sea lions jostle below the...

BEST WALKS

- **Port Gate to Barrio Inglés Loop** ~1.5 km · 20 min · easy — Exit the terminal gate, swing through the Caleta fish market to spot the sea lions, then follow the waterfront north into the Barrio...
- **Mirador Cruz del Tercer Milenio** ~10 min by taxi · short walk at top · easy — Take a taxi up El Vigía hill to the giant cross.

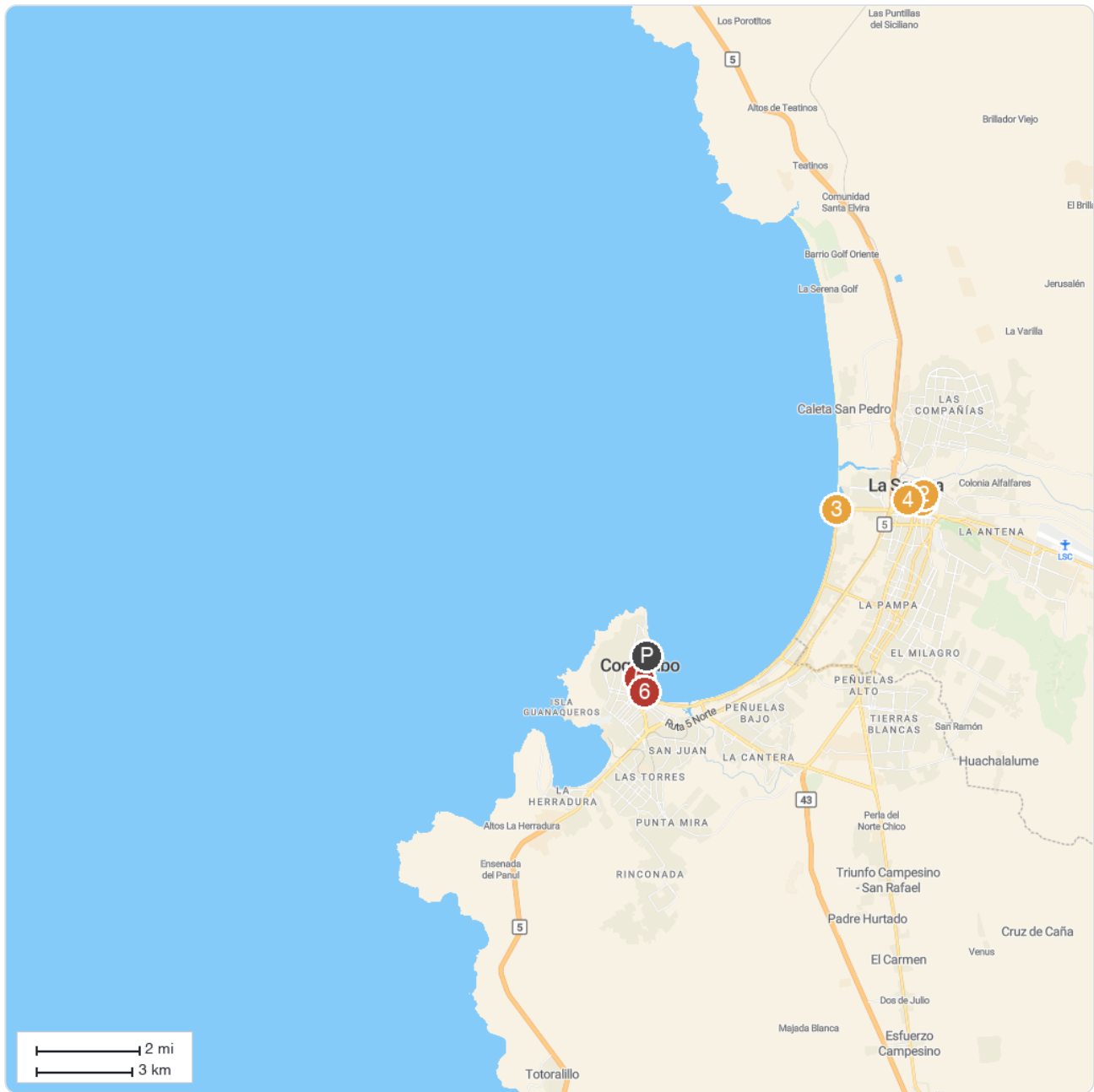
KNOW BEFORE YOU GO

- Use pesos. Taxis, the fish market, and cafes expect CLP. ATMs are plentiful in the city centre. Some vendors accept USD but at poor rates.
- Layer up for the camanchaca. The cold Pacific fog often blankets the port until late morning. Bring a jacket — it burns off quickly, revealing hot sunshine.
