An uninhabited coral atoll 1,000 km from Mahé, Cosmoledo is the Indian Ocean's answer to the Galápagos — wildlife so fearless it walks up to you, reefs untouched by mass tourism, and beaches that have never seen a sun lounger.

TOP THINGS TO DO

- Seabird Colony Walk — Wizard Island** — Walk the beach and interior of Grande Île (Wizard Island) through massive nesting colonies of red-footed boobies...
- Snorkeling the Pristine Reef** — Drop in directly from the beach or Zodiac onto coral gardens virtually untouched by tourism.
- Tidal Flat Exploration** — At low tide, walk the exposed flats with your expedition guide to spot juvenile reef sharks, stingrays, and hermit...
- Giant Trevally Fly-Fishing** — Cosmoledo is globally regarded as the GT Capital of the World.
- Sea Turtle Beach Watch** — Cosmoledo is one of the Seychelles' most important nesting beaches for green and hawksbill turtles.

BEST WALKS

- Wizard Island Beach Walk** 1.5–3 km • Easy • Sand & coral flat — A guided stroll along the sweeping white-sand beaches of Grande Île, weaving through seabird nesting colonies and stopping at the...
- Menai Island Lagoon Edge** 1–2 km • Easy • Sand & shallow water — Walk the lagoon-side beach of Menai Island at low tide, wading through ankle-deep crystal water watched over by nesting frigatebirds...
