

Daphne Island, Galápagos, Ecuador

A near-perfect volcanic cone rising from the Pacific, Daphne Major is one of the Galápagos' most iconic scientific sites — where Darwin's finches were observed evolving in real time. Expedition ships circle its sheer cliffs by zodiac for seabird spectacle and marine wildlife.

GETTING ASHORE

Docking: Anchor offshore; panga/zodiac ride around the island — no pier, no tourist landings

Best For: Seabird watching (blue-footed boobies, Nazca boobies, frigatebirds), Darwin's finches, volcanic geology

Walk to center: N/A — public landing is not permitted; viewing from water only

Don't Miss: Scanning the cliffs for blue-footed booby colonies and red-billed tropicbirds in flight

TOP THINGS TO DO

- Panga Circumnavigation** — Your main activity: a zodiac ride around Daphne Major's sheer tuff-cone cliffs.
 - Darwin's Finch Spotting** — Daphne Major is the site of the Grant study — 40+ years of real-time natural selection research on medium ground...
- Snorkeling Around Daphne Minor** — When conditions permit, zodiacs anchor near the smaller Daphne Minor islet for snorkeling.
 - Seabird Cliff-Nesting Observation** — Daphne Major hosts one of the densest seabird colonies in the central Galápagos.

KNOW BEFORE YOU GO

- Bring binoculars. Since you stay in the zodiac, high-magnification binoculars are essential to see Darwin's finches and nesting boobies on the cliffs.
- Use a long zoom lens. A 200mm–400mm telephoto will capture the birds far better than a phone camera from the panga.
- Take sea-sickness precautions. Waters around Daphne Major can be choppy; take anti-nausea medication before boarding the zodiac if you're susceptible.
