TOP THINGS TO DO

- Delos Archaeological Site** — Wander one of the best-preserved ancient cities in the Mediterranean — the Sacred Way, Sanctuary of Apollo, agora, theatre, and residential quarter...
- Terrace of the Lions** — Five archaic marble lions (originally around 12–16, dedicated by the Naxians ~600 BC) line the Sacred Way facing the Sacred Lake — one of the most...
- Delos Archaeological Museum** — On-site museum housing original mosaics, statues, pottery, and the original Lion replicas removed for preservation.
- Mykonos + Delos Combo Tour** — The most popular ship excursion format: morning in Mykonos Town, ferry to Delos with a guide, return by mid-afternoon.

BEST WALKS

- Sacred Way & Lion Circuit** 2–3 km | 2–3 hrs | Moderate — From the ferry jetty, follow the Sacred Way past the Sanctuary of Apollo, through the agora, up to the Terrace of the Lions, on to the Sacred Lake, then through the...

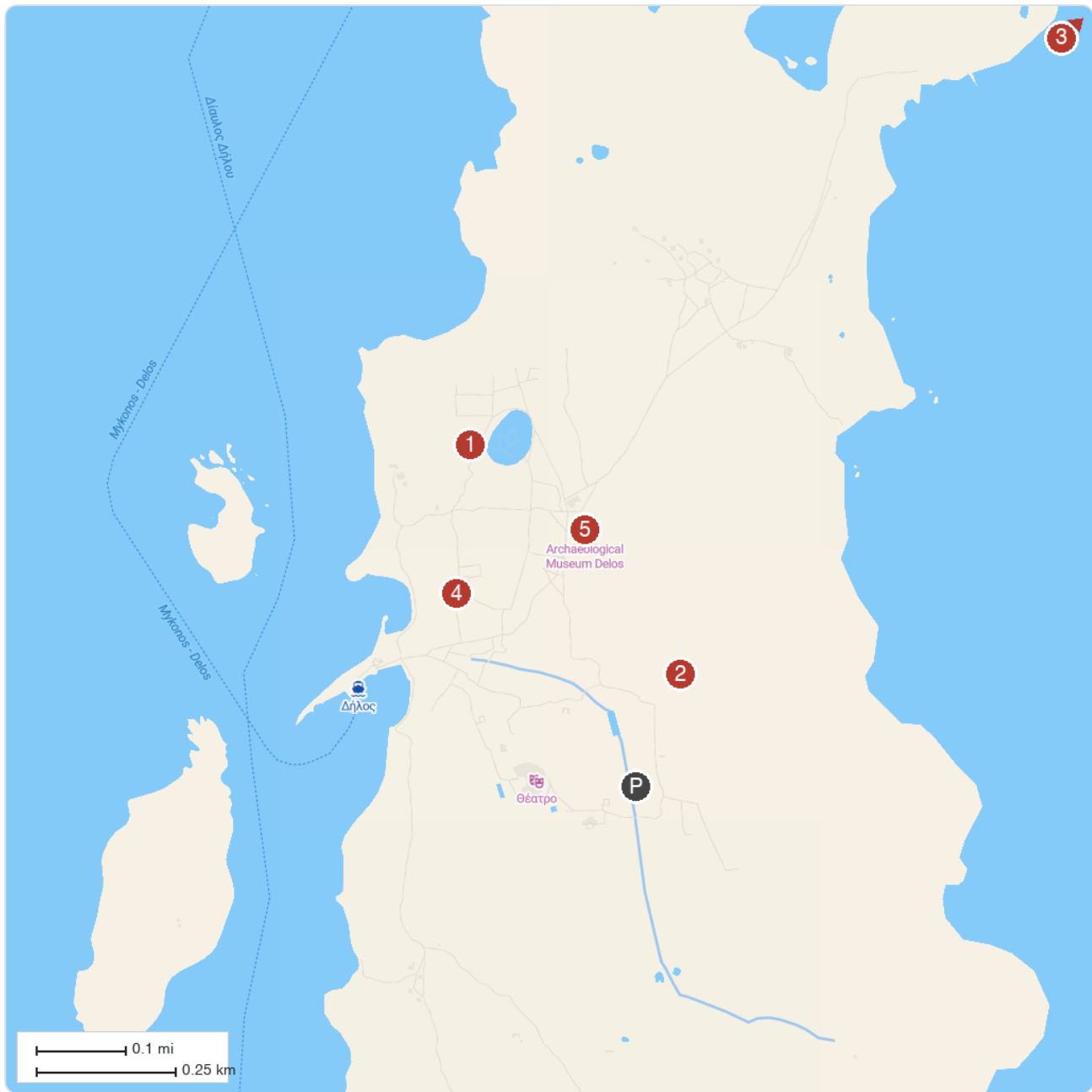
KNOW BEFORE YOU GO

- Bring everything you need. There is one small snack kiosk on-site (often crowded, limited stock). No restaurants, no supermarkets, no ATMs. Pack water (1.5L+ per person), snacks, a hat, and high-SPF sunscreen before leaving the ship.
- Watch your ferry time obsessively. The last ferry back to Mykonos typically departs around 7:00 PM in summer (3:00 PM in shoulder season). Missing it means no way off the island — overnight stays are illegal.
- Wear proper shoes. The entire site is ancient marble and uneven stone. Flip-flops or sandals are a sprained ankle waiting to happen. Closed-toe shoes with grip are essential.
- Wind is intense. Delos is an exposed Cycladic island with near-constant meltemi wind in summer. A hat with a chin strap is practical — loose hats blow away. Carry a light layer for the return ferry.
- Download an audio guide before leaving the ship. On-site signage is sparse. The Rick Steves app or PocketGuide Delos audio tour adds enormous context with no extra cost.
- Entry is €12 per person (free EU visitors under 25). Buy ferry tickets at the Old Port kiosk in Mykonos — the line moves quickly in the morning but gets longer mid-day.
