GETTING ASHORE

Docking: Alexandra Quay (Berth 33 or Berth 18), ~1.5–3 km from city centre; shuttle or taxi required from industrial zone

Best For: History, pub culture, literary heritage, Wicklow countryside day trips

Walk to Centre: Not walkable from berth — taxi €10–15, Luas tram from The Point, or cruise shuttle

Don't Miss: Book of Kells at Trinity College, Guinness Storehouse, and a pint in Temple Bar

- **Guinness Storehouse** — Seven floors of brewing history ending with a complimentary pint and 360° views from the Gravity Bar over Dublin's...
- **Trinity College & Book of Kells** — Walk the cobbled squares of Ireland's oldest university and see the 9th-century illuminated gospel manuscript in the...
- **Dublin City Hop-On Hop-Off Bus** — Cover all the highlights — Dublin Castle, Christ Church Cathedral, St.
- **Wicklow Mountains & Glendalough** — Head south into the 'Garden of Ireland' to visit the 6th-century monastic settlement of Glendalough in a glacial valley...
- **Boyne Valley — Newgrange & Hill of Tara** — Drive north to Ireland's Ancient East: Newgrange passage tomb (older than Stonehenge) and the Hill of Tara, seat of the...

BEST WALKS

- **Dublin City Centre Highlights Walk** 3–4 km · 1–1.5 hrs · Easy · Flat — Start at O'Connell Bridge and walk south across to Trinity College, continue to Dublin Castle and Christ Church Cathedral, then circle...
- **Phoenix Park Ramble** 3–5 km in park · 1.5 hrs · Easy · Free entry — Europe's largest urban park — home to wild fallow deer, Áras an Uachtaráin (President's residence), and the Wellington Monument.

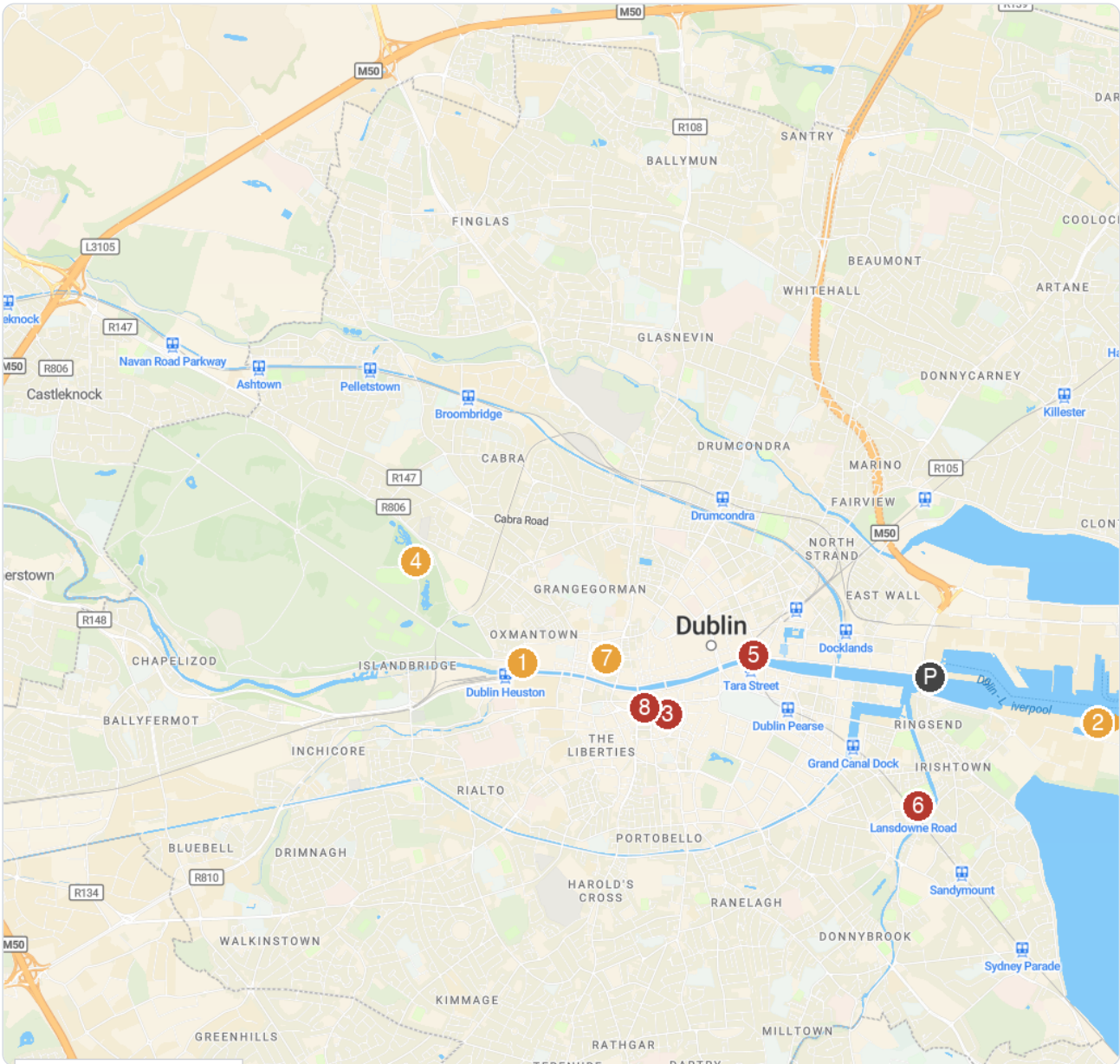

KNOW BEFORE YOU GO

- Walking from the berth is not allowed. The industrial port zone requires a shuttle, taxi (~€10–15), or Luas from The Point. Don't underestimate transfer time — allow 30–40 min to...
Don't book the Book of Kells and Guinness Storehouse. Both can sell out on busy port days, especially in summer. Booking online
