GETTING ASHORE

Docking: Large ships tender to Prince of Wales Pier or Custom House Quay; smaller ships (<240 m) dock at A&P Falmouth Docks or County Wharf

Best For: History buffs, garden lovers, coastal walkers, and day-trippers to wider Cornwall

Walk to Centre: Tenders land in the town centre; A&P Docks is a 10-20 min walk or shuttle along the waterfront

Don't Miss: Pendennis Castle views, the National Maritime Museum Cornwall, a Cornish pasty from a local bakery

Getting around: Taxi £10–£20 · Rideshare Uber

TOP THINGS TO DO

- Pendennis Castle** — Henry VIII built this coastal fortress in the 1540s to defend against French and Spanish invasion.
 - National Maritime Museum Cornwall** — Award-winning waterfront museum with interactive galleries on Britain's seafaring heritage, a working harbour pontoon...
 - Trebah & Glendurgan Gardens** — Two neighbouring subtropical valley gardens — Glendurgan is run by the
- National Trust, while Trebah is an independent...

 - Eden Project Day Trip** — The world-famous biomes built in a reclaimed china clay pit house rainforest and Mediterranean ecosystems.
 - St Mawes Ferry & Castle** — Jump on the passenger ferry from Custom House Quay to the postcard village of St Mawes (10 minutes).

BEST WALKS

- Town Centre & Waterfront Stroll** 1.5 miles · Easy · 45 min — From the Prince of Wales Pier, walk along the Events Square waterfront past the National Maritime Museum, up through the Events Square...
- Pendennis Castle Headland Walk** 2 miles · Moderate · 1 hr — Head southeast from the town centre through Falmouth's Victorian terraces up to the Pendennis headland.

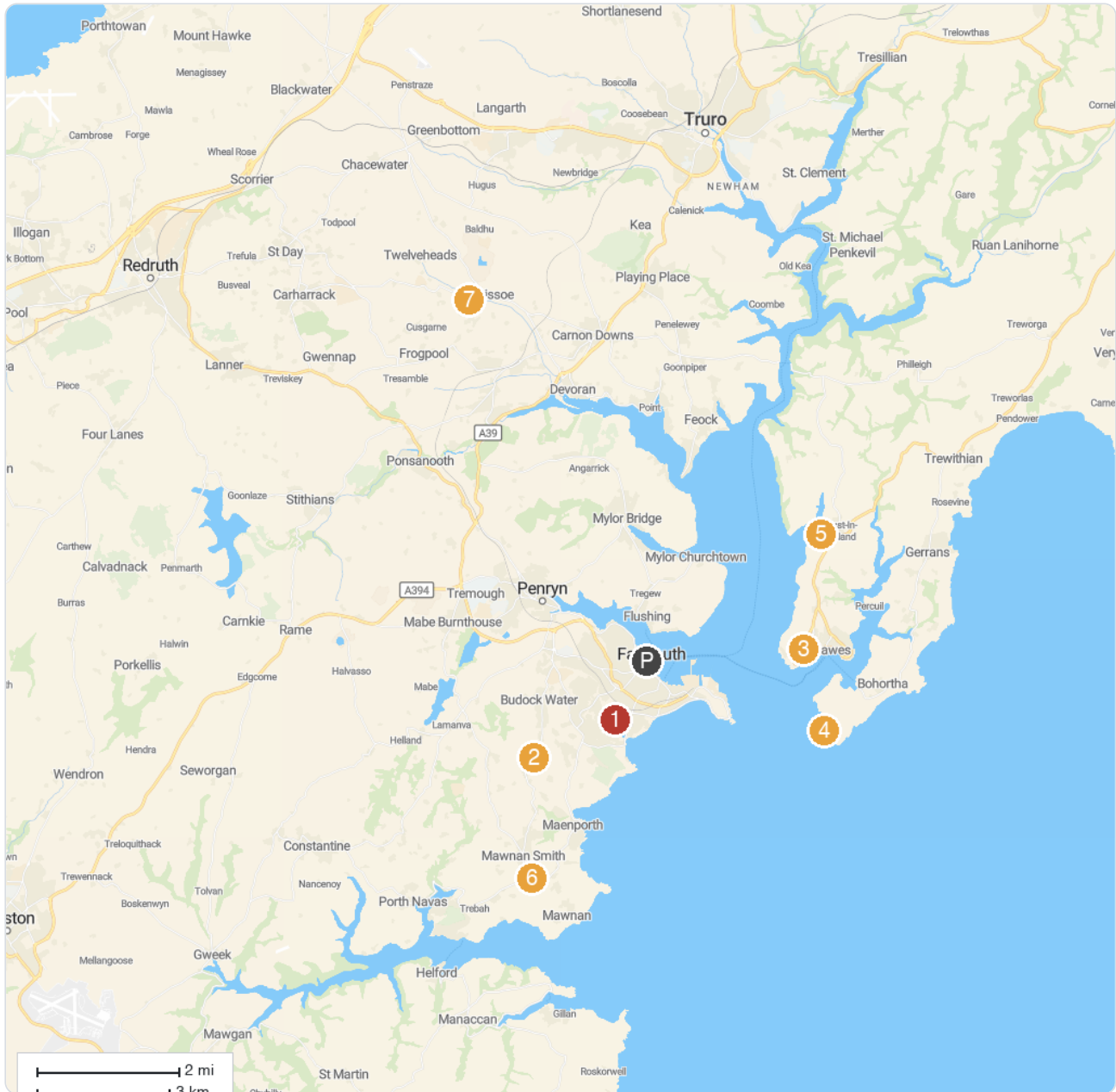
KNOW BEFORE YOU GO
