TOP THINGS TO DO

- Upper Rock Nature Reserve & Barbary Macaques** — Ride the cable car to the summit to meet Europe's only wild monkeys — the bold, curious Barbary macaques — and drink in...
- Skywalk & Windsor Suspension Bridge** — Stand on a glass-bottomed viewing platform 340 metres above sea level and cross a 71-metre suspension bridge hanging...
- Great Siege Tunnels & WWII Tunnels** — Explore the astonishing 18th-century tunnels hand-carved into the Rock during the Great Siege, then go deeper into the...
- St. Michael's Cave** — A vast, dramatically lit limestone cavern of stalactites and stalagmites that doubles as a natural concert hall.
- Dolphin Watching in the Bay** — The Bay of Gibraltar hosts resident pods of Common, Striped, and Bottlenose dolphins year-round.

BEST WALKS

- Terminal to Casemates Square via Ocean Village** ~2 km · 20 min · easy · flat — From the cruise terminal, walk north along the western waterfront past Ocean Village marina (dolphin-boat departures, waterfront...
- Main Street to Cable Car & Alameda Gardens** ~1.5 km · 20 min · easy — Head south down pedestrian Main Street past the Governor's residence (The Convent), Cathedral Square, and down to the Alameda Botanic...
- Europa Point** short bus or taxi · 30 min each way — The Rock's southern tip: the red-and-white lighthouse, the Ibrahim-al-Ibrahim Mosque, and on clear days a spectacular view across the...

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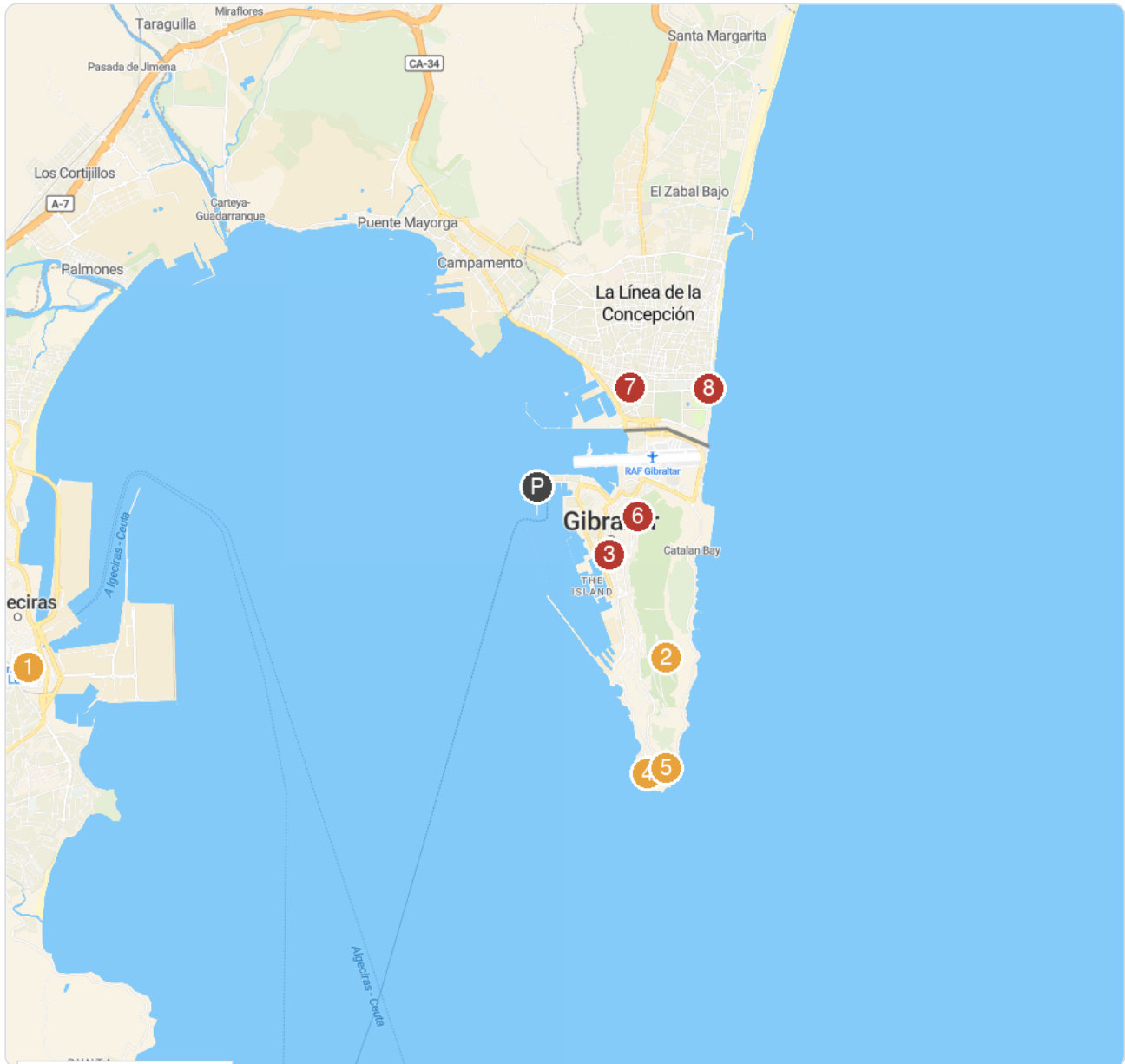
KNOW BEFORE YOU GO
