TOP THINGS TO DO

- **Cimavilla Old Quarter & Cerro de Santa Catalina** — Wander the cobblestone streets of Gijón's historic fisherman's quarter, climb to Eduardo Chillida's Elogio del... beach.
- **Termas Romanas de Campo Valdés** — Underground 1st-century Roman public baths at the foot of Playa de San Lorenzo — one of Spain's best-preserved urban...
- **La Laboral Ciudad de la Cultura** — Spain's largest building — a vast mid-20th-century complex with a 117-metre tower, church dome, and courtyard.
- **Playa de San Lorenzo Promenade** — Stroll El Muro, the broad seafront promenade alongside Gijón's 1.5 km crescent
- **Asturian Cider House Lunch** — Join locals in a sidrería for the full ritual: escanciado pouring from height, a culín of sharp sidra, and plates of...

BEST WALKS

- **Marina to Cimavilla to San Lorenzo Loop** 3–4 km · 1.5–2 hrs · Easy–Moderate — Start at the Marina's red Gijón letters, walk north into Cimavilla's old quarter, climb Cerro de Santa Catalina for the Chillida...
- **Marina & Poniente Beach Stroll** 1–2 km · 45 min · Easy — A relaxed flat walk along the sheltered Poniente Beach from the Marina to the Aquarium — good for families or those wanting calm water...

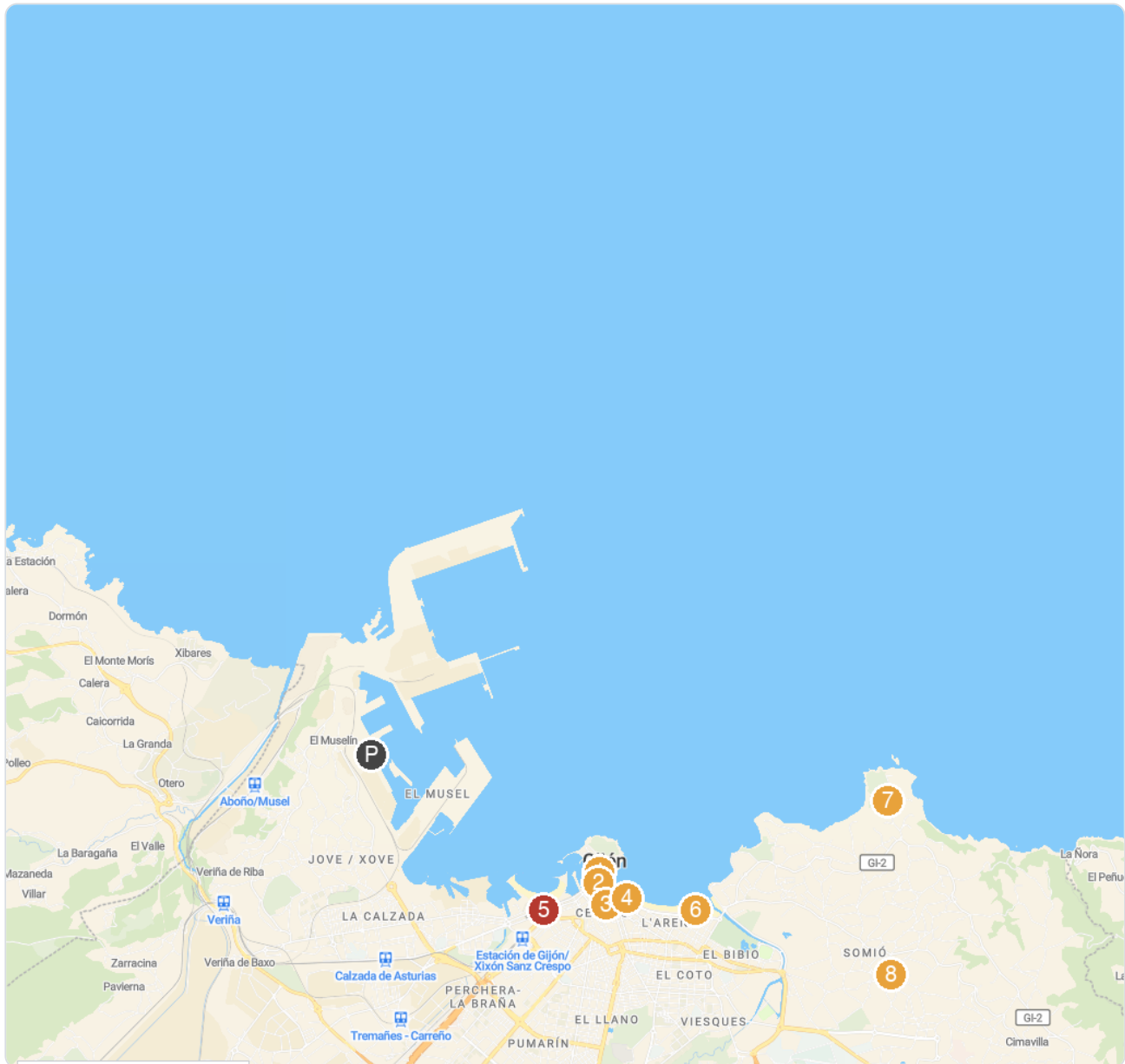
KNOW BEFORE YOU GO
