GETTING ASHORE

Docking: Tender — ships anchor in Bantry Bay; boats to Glengarriff Pier

Best For: Garinish Island gardens, seal watching, woodland walks

Walk to village: 5–10 min from tender pier to village centre

Don't Miss: Ferry to Garinish Island — book the earliest tender to fit it in

 Getting around:  **Taxi**  €27–€35 to Bantry

TOP THINGS TO DO

- Garinish Island (Innacullin) Gardens** — Board the Blue Pool Ferry or Harbour Queen for a 15-min crossing to this world-famous island garden.
- Bantry House & Gardens** — A 15-minute drive brings you to one of Ireland's great 18th-century stately homes.
- Caha Pass Mountain Drive** — Hire a driver or join a tour for the spectacular road over the Caha Mountains toward Kenmare.
- Glengarriff Woods Nature Reserve** — One of Ireland's best-preserved ancient oak forests, a 20-minute walk or short taxi ride from the pier.
- Blue Pool & Village Wander** — The Blue Pool is a magical tidal inlet right behind the village where river meets sea — perfect for a short woodland...

BEST WALKS

- Tender Pier to Village & Blue Pool Loop** 1.5 km · 20–30 min · Easy · Free — From the tender pier, walk into the village past craft shops and pubs, then follow the signs to the Blue Pool — a serene tidal pool...
- Glengarriff Woods Nature Reserve** 2–4 km · 1–1.5 hrs · Easy to moderate · Free — A short taxi or 20-min walk from the village brings you to ancient sessile oak woodland with several looped trails.

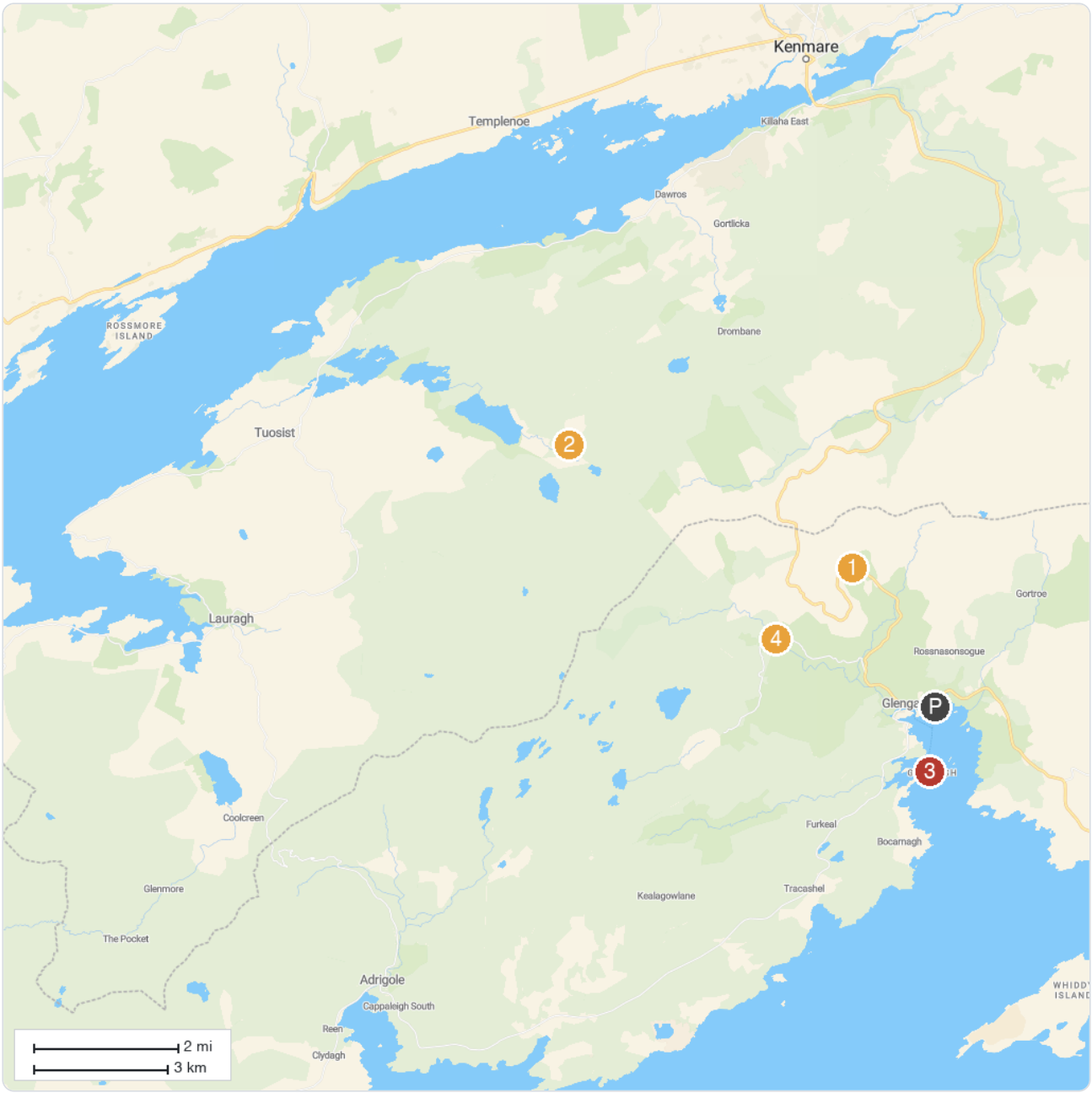
KNOW BEFORE YOU GO

- Get an early tender ticket. If Garinish Island is on your list — and it should be — collect your tender number as soon as the desk opens. The ferry and the island take 2–3 hours...
- Rain jacket is non-negotiable. The Gulf Stream keeps it mild but West Cork showers arrive fast. Pack a waterproof layer even on
