

Isla Parida, Chiriquí, Panama

A protected island in the Gulf of Chiriquí National Marine Park, Isla Parida is one of Panama's last truly wild shores — no piers, no crowds, just jungle, coral reefs, and howler monkeys echoing across the bay.

GETTING ASHORE

Docking: Anchor-out; Zodiac/tender wet landing onto beach

TOP THINGS TO DO

- Snorkeling the Reef** — Don mask and fins right off Playa Grande or board a Zodiac to nearby coral heads.
 - Jungle Trail Hike** — Rustic paths cut through primary rainforest behind the main beach.
 - Kayaking & Paddleboarding** — Most expedition ships deploy their own water-sports kit on the beach.
- Zodiac Mangrove Tour** — Glide through the tangled root systems fringing the island in an inflatable boat with a naturalist guide.
 - Sportfishing in the Gulf of Chiriquí** — The gulf is world-renowned for offshore fishing — black marlin, yellowfin tuna, dorado, and roosterfish patrol these waters.

BEST WALKS

- Playa Grande Beach Stroll** Easy · ~1 km · 20 min — Walk the full crescent of Playa Grande from the Zodiac landing point.
- Jungle Trail from the Beach** Easy–moderate · 1–3 km · 30–60 min — Follow the dirt path that heads inland from behind the main beach into primary rainforest.

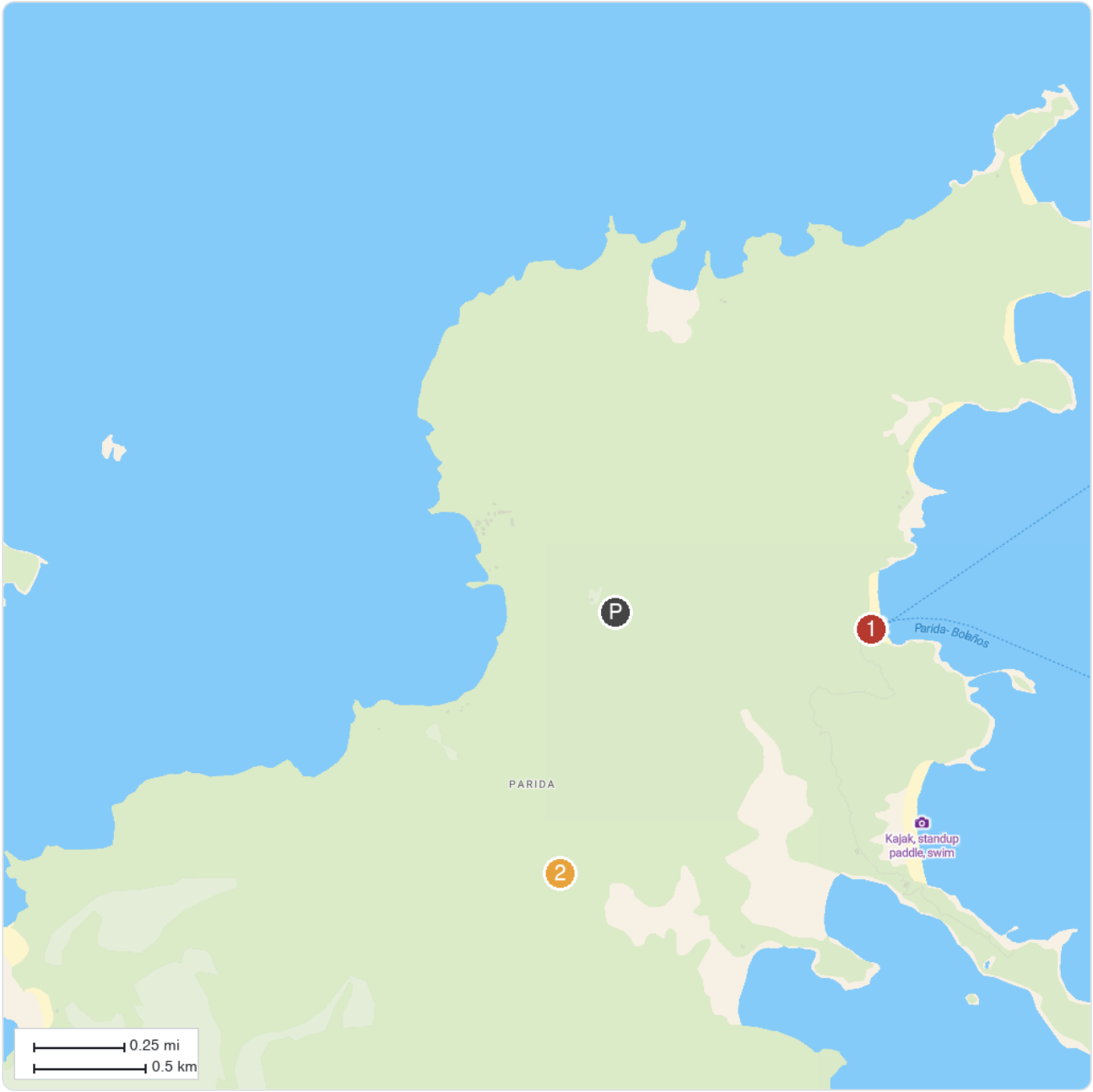
KNOW BEFORE YOU GO

- Water shoes are mandatory. The wet landing puts you ankle-to-knee deep in the surf. Flip-flops get pulled off; proper water shoes or adventure sandals keep you stable on the rocky/sandy bottom.
- Insect repellent — don't skip it. Sandflies (no-see-ums) are brutal in shaded jungle areas and near dusk. DEET or Picaridin applied before you go ashore is the difference between a great day and a miserable one.
- Pack a dry bag. Salt spray on the Zodiac ride is real. Put your phone, camera, and dry clothes in a dry bag before boarding the tender.
- July–October: humpback whale season. Southern Hemisphere humpbacks breed and calve in the Gulf of Chiriquí. Watch from the ship's deck or during Zodiac rides — sightings are common.
- Bring a few small bills. Panama uses US dollars. There are no shops on the island, but occasional local caretakers sell fresh coconuts. A few \$1–\$5 bills cover tips and any small purchases.
- No connectivity. Cell service is non-existent on the island. Download offline maps before you leave the ship and let someone aboard know your plans if you're hiking far.
