GETTING ASHORE

Docking: King's Wharf or Heritage Wharf — large ships dock directly, no tender

Best For: History, pink-sand beaches, snorkelling, day-trip to Hamilton

Walk to centre: Dockyard shops & museum within 5–10 min on foot; Hamilton 20 min by ferry

Don't Miss: National Museum of Bermuda in Commissioner's House, Horseshoe Bay Beach

Getting around: **Taxi** \$34–\$45 to Hamilton · **Rideshare** not available

TOP THINGS TO DO

- **National Museum of Bermuda** — Housed in the restored Commissioner's House — one of the world's oldest buildings with a prefabricated cast-iron frame...
- **Horseshoe Bay Beach** — Bermuda's most famous beach, with soft pink sand and turquoise water on the South Shore.
- **Crystal Caves** — Underground cathedral of stalactites and crystal-clear flooded caverns in Hamilton Parish.
- **St. George's UNESCO Town** — One of the oldest English-founded towns in the New World, with 17th-century forts, cobblestone alleys, and the...
- **Snorkelling & Shipwreck Catamaran** — Bermuda has some of the Atlantic's best accessible wrecks and reefs.

BEST WALKS

- **Dockyard Loop** 1.5 km · 30 min · Easy — A relaxed circuit of the entire Dockyard grounds, taking in Clocktower Mall, Bermuda Arts Centre, Dockyard Glassworks, Snorkel Park...
- **Hamilton Waterfront Stroll** 1 km in Hamilton · Easy · Ferry required — Catch the Blue Route ferry to Hamilton and walk along Front Street — pastel colonial buildings, boutiques, the Cabinet Building, and...

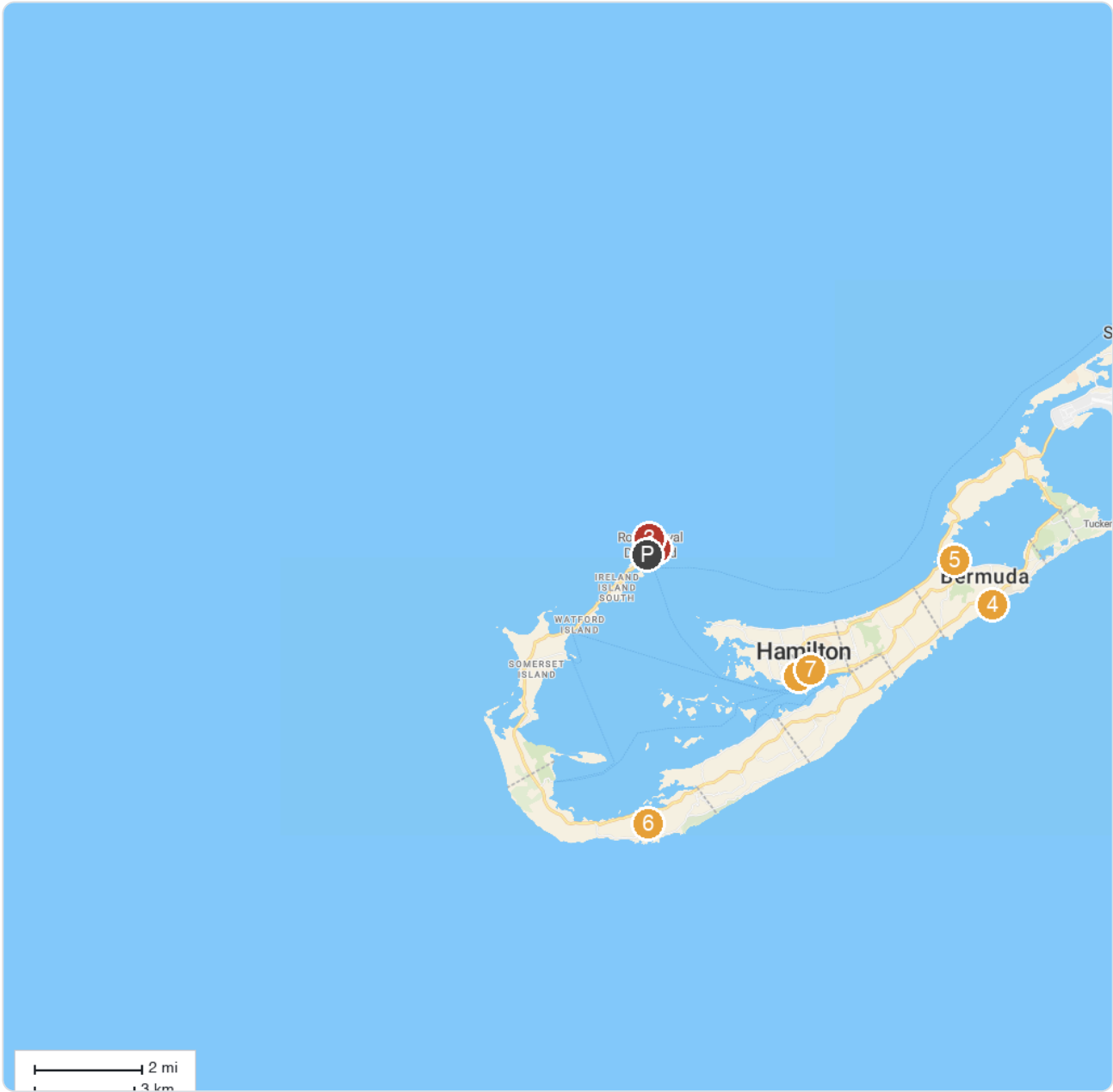
KNOW BEFORE YOU GO

- USD is king here. The Bermudian dollar is pegged 1:1 to the US dollar and both are accepted everywhere. No need to exchange — you may get BMD coins as change.
- Buy a multi-day transport pass. The combined bus + ferry pass covers unlimited travel and saves money vs. paying per ride. Available at the Dockyard Visitor Services Centre.
