One of Alaska's newest cruise destinations, Klawock sits on Prince of Wales Island where an Indigenous-owned floating pier welcomes small ships to a world of authentic totem poles, old-growth rainforest, and world-class sportfishing — with no jewelry chains in sight.

GETTING ASHORE

Docking: Floating pontoon pier, Klawock Island — walk off the ship, no tender

Best For: Tlingit culture, totem poles, sport fishing, wildlife, authentic Alaska

Walk to Totem Park: Free shuttle (5 min) or 1.3-mile walk across the bridge to town

Don't Miss: Klawock Totem Park — 21 restored poles overlooking the harbor

Getting around: Taxi + (Craig to pier) · Rideshare not available

TOP THINGS TO DO

- Klawock Totem Park** — Twenty-one beautifully restored Tlingit totem poles stand on a hillside overlooking Klawock harbor — replicated from 19th-century originals from the...
- Tlingit Carving Shed** — Near the Totem Park, master Tlingit carvers work on totems and canoes in an open shed.
- Klawock River Hatchery & Salmon Run** — Just outside of town, the Klawock River Salmon Hatchery is a top spot to watch thousands of salmon fighting upstream (best July–August).
- Sport Fishing Charter** — Prince of Wales Island is legendary for halibut and salmon.
- Kayak & Skiff Eco-Tour** — Guided water tours around the sheltered islands of Klawock Harbor offer excellent chances to spot sea otters, harbor seals, humpback whales, and...

BEST WALKS

- Pier to Klawock Totem Park** 1.3 miles | 25-30 min | Easy — Walk from the Port Klawock terminal across the bridge onto Prince of Wales Island and uphill to the Totem Park.
- Totem Park to Carving Shed Loop** 0.5 miles | 15-20 min | Easy — From the Totem Park, walk down to the Klawock Carving Shed where Tlingit artists work on poles and canoes, then back through downtown Klawock past the small harbor.

KNOW BEFORE YOU GO

- Gear up for rain. Klawock is in the Tongass National Forest — a temperate rainforest. Bring a quality rain jacket and waterproof shoes regardless of the forecast.
- Skip the 'Town Transfer' excursion. The port provides a complimentary shuttle to the Totem Park and Craig. No need to pay ship prices just to reach town.
- Carry some cash. Cards are accepted at the port terminal, but local artisans at the Carving Shed and roadside stands may prefer cash.
- Black bears are common near the river during salmon runs (July–August). Keep distance, don't carry open food near the water, and never approach wildlife.
- Respect the totems. These are sacred cultural items of living Tlingit culture. Don't touch the poles unless invited, and ask permission before photographing Elders.
- Book fishing charters early. Prince of Wales is world-famous for halibut and salmon — independent charter boats fill up months in advance for peak season.
