

Kom Ombo, Upper Egypt, Egypt

Perched on a dramatic bend of the Nile 48 km north of Aswan, Kom Ombo is one of Egypt's most photogenic temple stops — and your ship ties up close enough to walk straight to the ancient stones.

- Moored (Nile riverbank pier)
- Typical call: 2–3 hrs
- Egyptian Pound (EGP); temple ticket cashless card only
- Arabic; English widely spoken at sites
- UNESCO-listed Ptolemaic temple

GETTING ASHORE

Docking: Ships moor alongside the Nile promenade; gangway direct to shore

Walk to Temple: 2–5 min up a paved incline from the gangway

Best For: Ancient history, Egyptology, sunset photography

Don't Miss: The Crocodile Museum and the surgical-instrument reliefs on the rear temple wall

Getting around: Taxi ~LE 20–50 (~bin/zsh.40–) · Rideshare not available

TOP THINGS TO DO

- Temple of Kom Ombo** — The only double temple in Egypt, built by Ptolemaic pharaohs between 180–47 BC.
- Crocodile Museum** — Housed inside the temple complex and included with your entry ticket.
- Ancient Nilometer & Medical Reliefs** — Inside the temple precinct, spot the ancient Nilometer — a stone-lined well
- priests used to measure the Nile flood and...
- Nile Sunset from the Temple Terrace** — Many ships dock in the late afternoon.
- Kom Ombo Souk** — The bazaar between the temple and the pier sells alabaster statues, papyrus, scarabs, and spices.

BEST WALKS

- Promenade to Temple Loop** 0.3 km · 5 min one-way · Easy — Walk off the gangway, cross the promenade, and follow the paved incline up to the temple entrance.

KNOW BEFORE YOU GO

- Cashless temple entry: The ticket office accepts credit/debit cards only — no Egyptian pounds. Bring a card. Small bills in EGP are still useful for tipping guards or buying...
- Night calls are magical: If your ship docks after sunset, the temple is floodlit in warm gold. Don't stay onboard — it's one of Egypt's most atmospheric night experiences.
- Raft-walking: When multiple ships are moored side-by-side, you may need to walk through another ship's interior to reach shore.
