- Souq Al-Mubarakiya** — Kuwait's oldest and most atmospheric market has traded for over 200 years.
- Kuwait Towers & the Corniche** — The trio of sphere-covered towers is Kuwait's most recognizable landmark.
- Grand Mosque Guided Tour** — Kuwait's official state mosque (Al Masjid Al Kabir) is stunning inside and out — intricate Islamic calligraphy, ornate...
- Sheikh Abdullah Al Salem Cultural Centre** — One of the largest museum complexes in the world, housing four world-class museums: the Space Museum, Science Museum...
- Al Shaheed Park** — Kuwait's largest urban park offers botanical gardens, walking paths, lakes, modern sculptures, and two small on-site...

BEST WALKS

- Kuwait Corniche to Kuwait Towers** 2 km | Easy | Flat seafront promenade — Drop off near the Scientific Center on the Gulf Road and walk the breezy Corniche south past the dhow harbor to the Kuwait Towers.

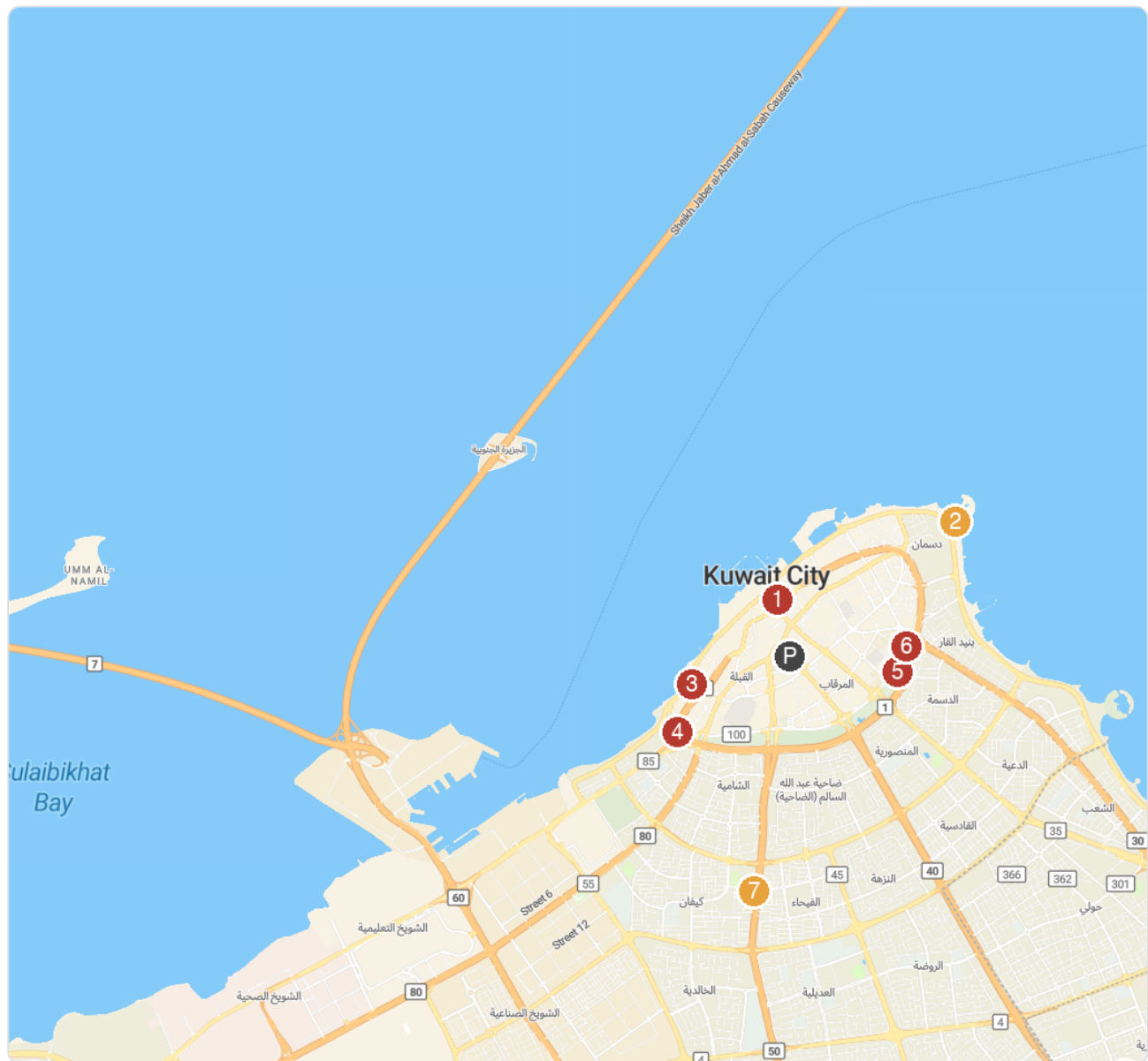
KNOW BEFORE YOU GO

- Kuwait is 100% dry. Alcohol is illegal throughout the country — not sold anywhere. Do not attempt to bring alcohol off the ship.
- Dress conservatively. Cover shoulders and knees for both men and women. Women don't need head coverings in public, but carry a scarf for mosque visits.
- The Kuwaiti Dinar is the world's most valuable currency. Cards are widely accepted: keep a few KWD in cash for souq stalls and
