GETTING ASHORE

Docking: Tender — ships moor at Greenwich Ship Tier (mid-river); ~5-min tender to Greenwich Pier

Best For: History, maritime heritage, easy day trip to central London

Walk to centre: Cutty Sark 1 min · Greenwich Market 3 min · Royal Observatory 15-20 min (steep hill)

Don't Miss: Standing on the Prime Meridian line at the Royal Observatory

TOP THINGS TO DO

- Royal Observatory & Prime Meridian** — Climb Greenwich Park's hill to stand astride the Prime Meridian at longitude 0°.
- Cutty Sark & Old Royal Naval College** — Step aboard the world's only surviving Victorian tea clipper — walk the decks and beneath the copper-clad hull.
- National Maritime Museum & Queen's House** — Free entry to the world's largest maritime museum, featuring Admiral Nelson's bullet-holed coat and a gilded royal barge.
- London City Day Trip via Thames Clipper** — Ride the scenic Uber Boat river bus from Greenwich Pier past Canary Wharf and the Tower of London to Westminster.
- Greenwich Market & Historic Pubs** — Greenwich Market operates daily under its Victorian roof with global street food stalls — Ethiopian, Asian noodles...

BEST WALKS

- Greenwich Heritage Loop** 2.5 km · ~1 hr · Easy to moderate — Walk from the pier past the Cutty Sark, through the grounds of the Old Royal Naval College, into Greenwich Park, up to the Royal...
- Riverside Stroll to the Trafalgar Tavern** 1 km · ~20 min · Easy — Head east along the riverbank from the pier, past the old Greenwich Power Station and the classical facade of the Naval College, to...

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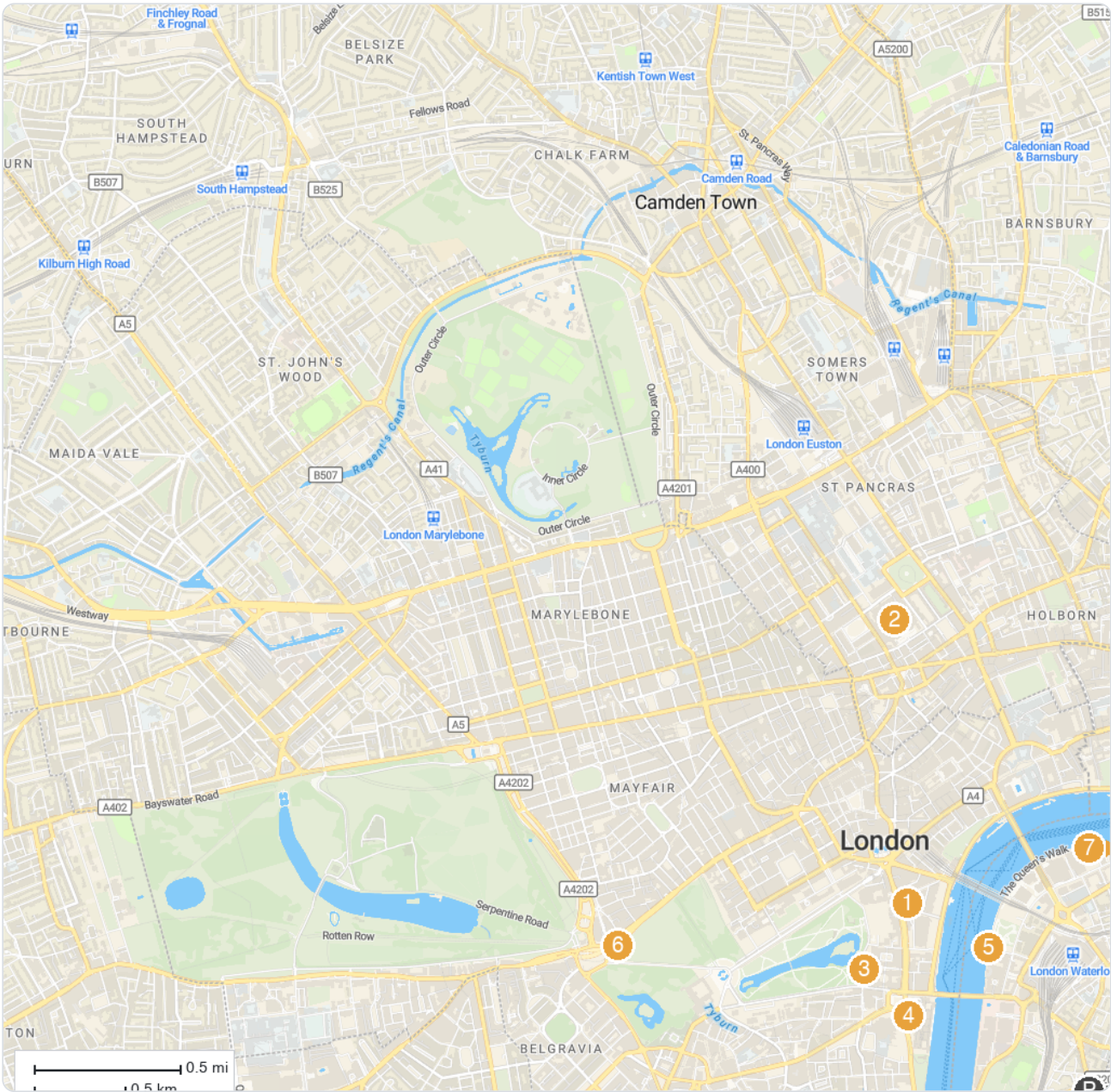
KNOW BEFORE YOU GO
