- Sag Harbor Main Street Loop** 1.5 miles · Easy · 45-60 min — From the village dock, walk up Main Street past the Old Whalers' Church (1844), the Sag Harbor Whaling & Historical Museum, and the...
- Greenport Waterfront Stroll** 1 mile · Easy · 30-45 min — Walk from the ferry dock along the waterfront to Mitchell Park, take a spin on the 1920s carousel, then browse Front Street's...

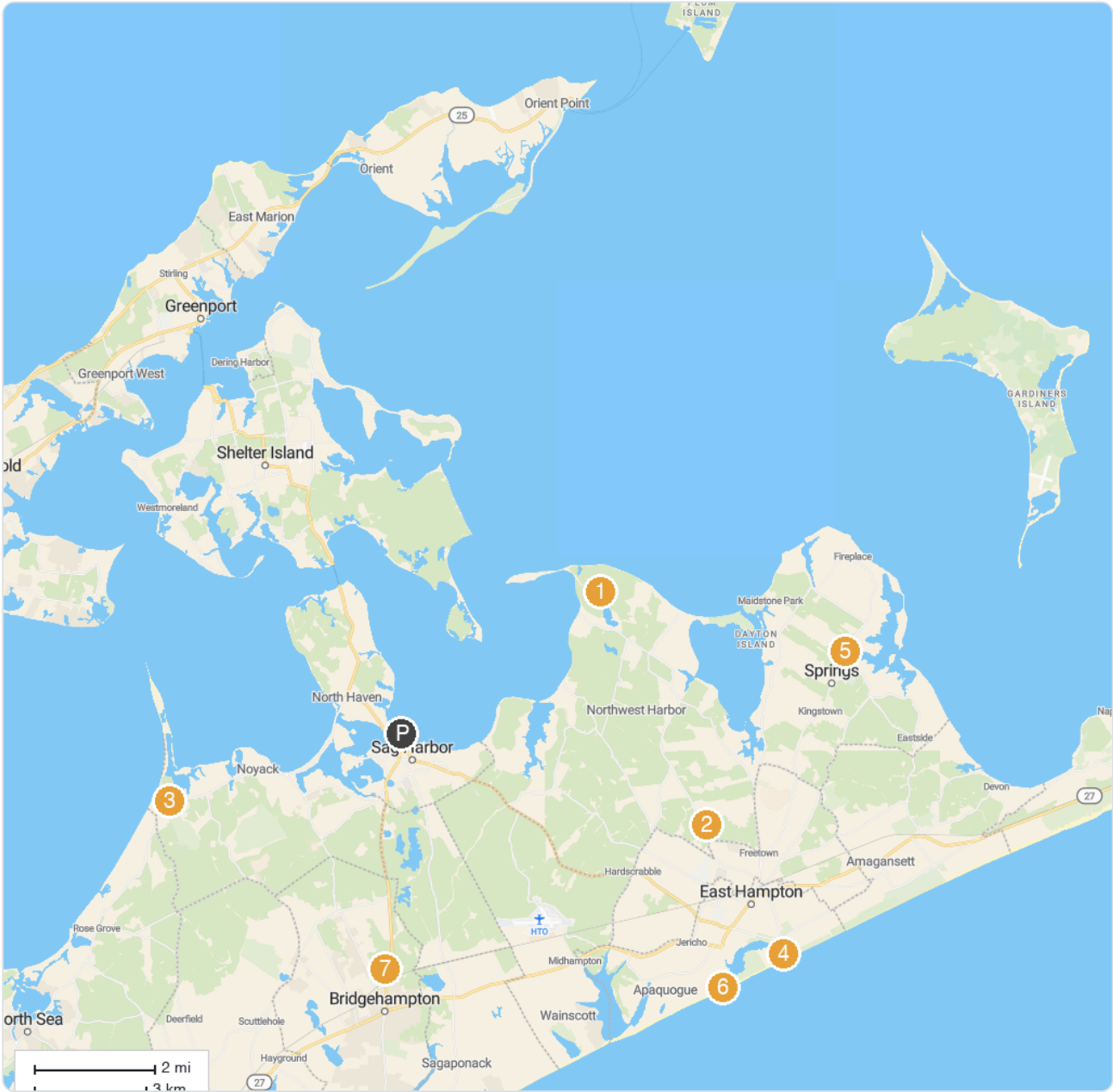
KNOW BEFORE YOU GO
