GETTING ASHORE

Docking: Tender for most ships; small/expedition vessels may dock at city pier

Best For: Indigenous culture, Tsimshian dance performances, totem poles

Walk to center: ~0.3–0.5 mi (5–10 min) from tender drop at small boat harbor

Don't Miss: Longhouse cultural show & the carving shed — both are world-class

Getting around: Taxi \$5–\$15

TOP THINGS TO DO

- Tsimshian Longhouse Cultural Performance** — The signature Metlakatla experience.
- William Duncan Cottage Museum** — The restored 1891 home of William Duncan, the Anglican missionary who led 823 Tsimshian people from British Columbia to found Metlakatla in 1887.
- Carving Shed Visit & Tsimshian Artists** — Watch master Tsimshian carvers at work on totem poles, canoes, and ceremonial masks — and ask questions.
- Yellow Hill Boardwalk Trail** — A scenic boardwalk trail climbing through old-growth rainforest to the open summit of Yellow Hill, with panoramic views over Annette Island, the...

BEST WALKS

- Town Cultural Walk** 0.6 mi · 20–30 min · Flat & easy — From the harbor, stroll along the waterfront past the totem poles to the Longhouse, then loop through town past the William Duncan Memorial Church, the school's carved...

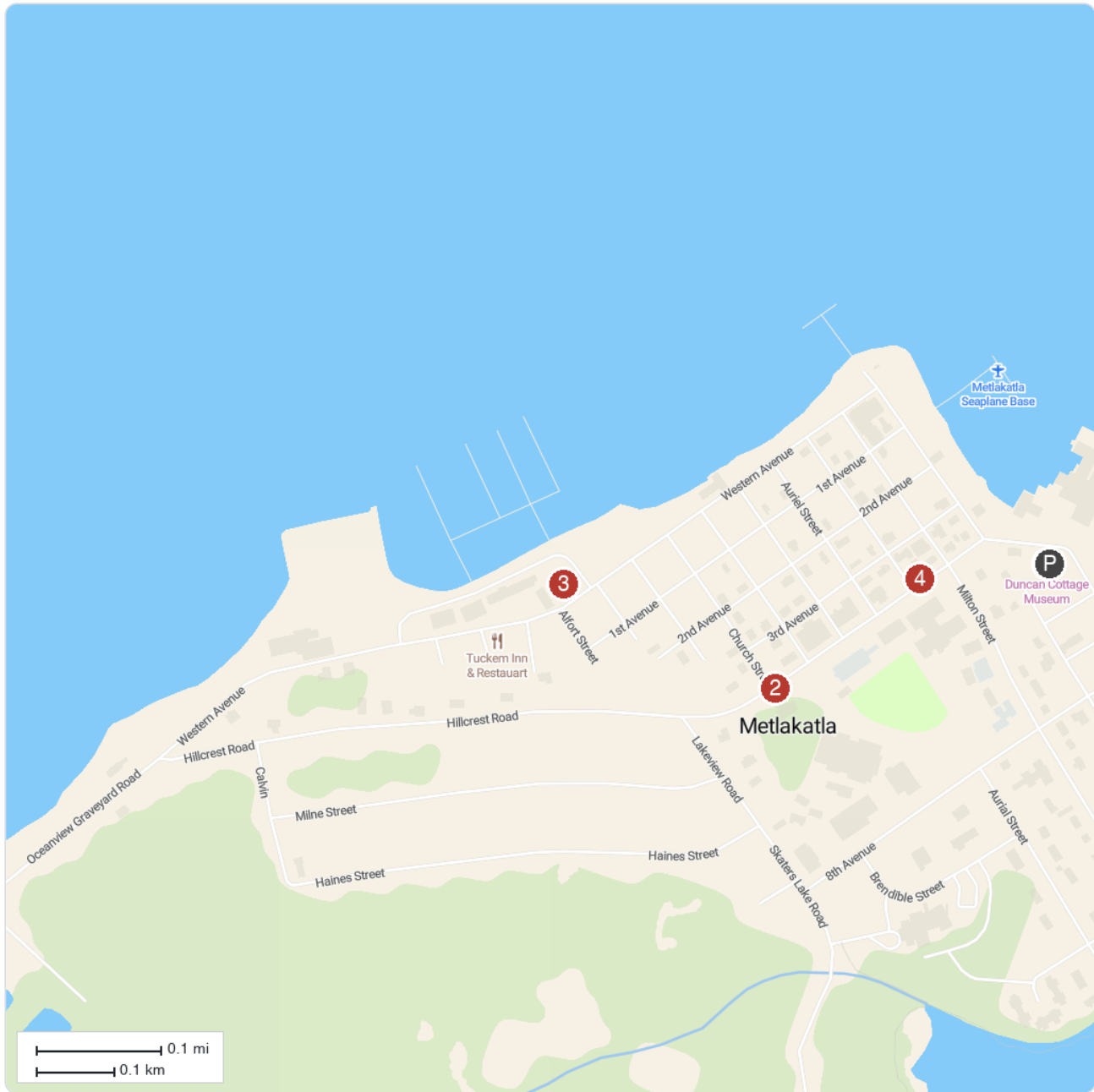
KNOW BEFORE YOU GO

- Dry community — no exceptions. Metlakatla prohibits all alcohol on the reserve. Do not bring any ashore; violations are taken seriously.
- Bring small USD cash. Local vendors, the museum, and the carving shed often don't take cards. The island ATM can run out on busy cruise days.
- Ask before you photograph people. This is a living community. Always request permission before photographing residents, elders, or children — the totem poles and church are fair game.
- Dress for rain. Metlakatla averages 120+ inches of rain per year. Waterproof layers and sturdy shoes are essential, not optional.
- Book the longhouse show in advance. Capacity is limited and it sells out. If your cruise line offers it as a shore excursion, book early — this is the must-do of Metlakatla.
- Find the fry bread. Local vendors set up near the longhouse on cruise days serving Tsimshian fry bread — plain, with jam, or as Indian tacos. Don't leave without one.
