

Milos Island, Cyclades, Greece

Milos is the volcanic oddity of the Cyclades — white lunar rock formations tumbling into cobalt sea, hidden sea caves accessible only by boat, and a hilltop capital where the Venus de Milo was unearthed. It rewards curious cruisers who venture beyond the port.

- Adamas Waterfront Stroll** 1 km · Flat · 20 min — Walk the full length of the Adamas waterfront from the tender pier past harbour tavernas, the Milos Mining Museum, and the Holy...
- Adamas to Plaka Hilltop** 5 km one-way · Moderate · Or take the bus — Follow the road northwest up to Plaka — the whitewashed hilltop capital — then continue to the Kastro (Venetian castle ruins) for...

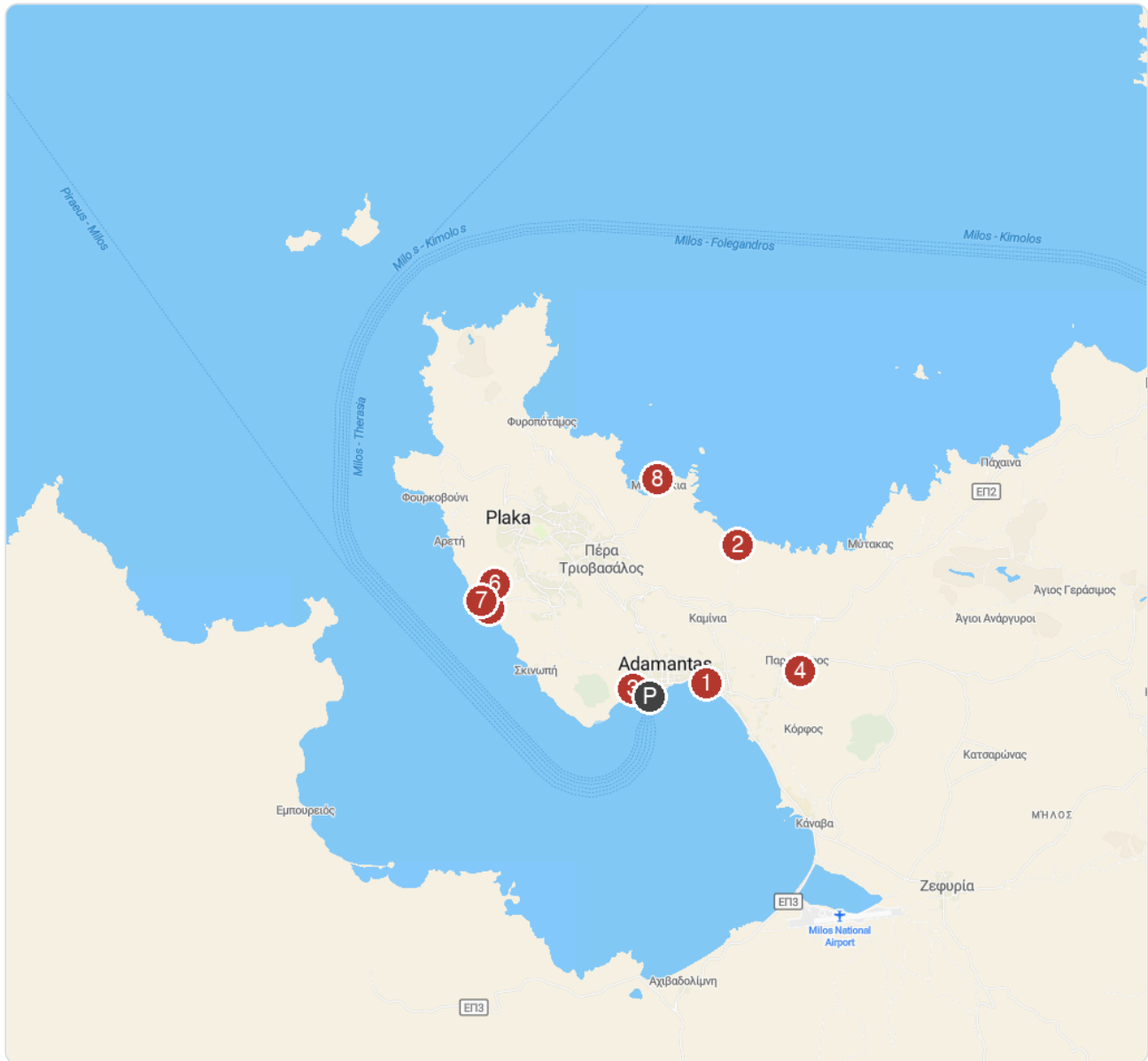
KNOW BEFORE YOU GO
