GETTING ASHORE

Docking: Pier — ships dock directly at the downtown terminal (201 S. Water St.)

Best For: Southern history, Mardi Gras culture, Gulf Coast cuisine, battleship fans

Walk to center: Dauphin Street shops & restaurants ~0.5 mi; Fort Condé ~0.3 mi

Don't Miss: USS Alabama Battleship Memorial Park (short drive) and the Mobile Carnival Museum

TOP THINGS TO DO

- **USS Alabama Battleship Memorial Park** — Board the massive WWII battleship USS Alabama and explore the submarine USS Drum, vintage aircraft, and military...
 - **Mobile Carnival Museum** — Discover why Mobile — not New Orleans — claims the title of America's original Mardi Gras city (founded 1703).
 - **Fort Condé & Downtown Historic Walk** — Start at the reconstructed 18th-century French fort (free entry) with
- costumed guides and cannon demonstrations, then...

 - **GulfQuest National Maritime Museum** — An impressive waterfront museum with 90+ interactive exhibits covering Gulf of Mexico maritime heritage — shipwrecks...
 - **Dauphin Street Dining & MoonPie Store** — Wander Mobile's historic restaurant row for Gulf shrimp po'boys, gumbo, and classic Southern plates.

BEST WALKS

- **Waterfront to Dauphin Street** 0.5 mi | Easy | 30–45 min — Head north from the terminal along Water Street to the GulfQuest Maritime Museum, then cut up to Fort Condé and continue to the lively...
- **Historic Core Loop** 1 mi | Easy | 45–60 min — From Dauphin Street, loop through Bienville Square, past the Cathedral Basilica, and back down to the waterfront past the History...

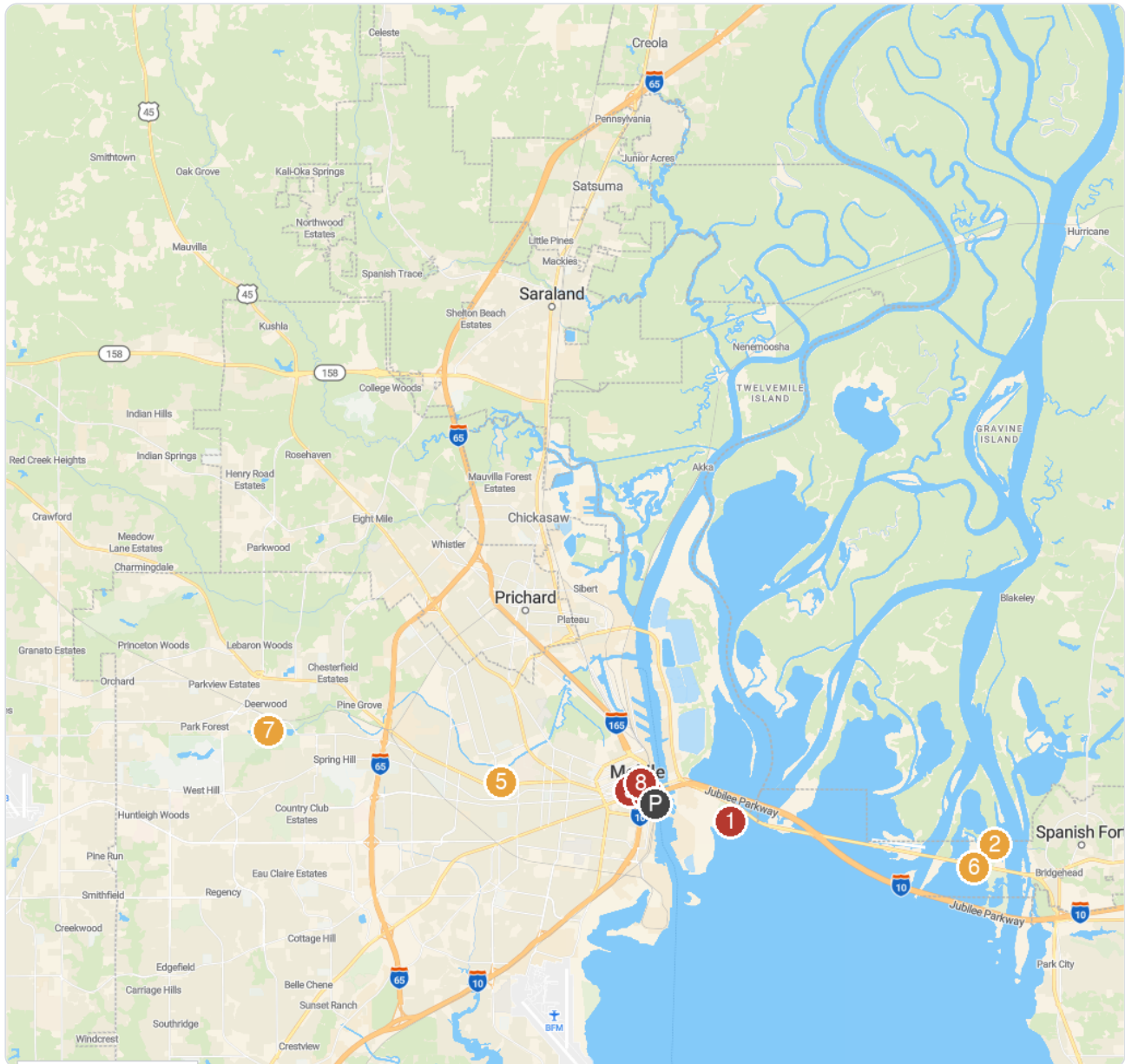
KNOW BEFORE YOU GO
