

Nanortalik, South Greenland, Greenland

Greenland's southernmost town, where the name means 'Place of Polar Bears' — a compact Inuit settlement framed by cathedral granite spires, drifting icebergs, and an open-air museum that brings the old colonial era to life.

TOP THINGS TO DO

- **Nanortalik Open-Air Museum** — A genuine highlight: preserved turf houses, old colonial wooden buildings, a peat-walled church, and a traditional umiak (skin boat) tell the full... icebergs.
- **Tasermiut Fjord by Boat** — The Tasermiut Fjord is one of Greenland's most spectacular landscapes — sheer granite walls rising over 1,000 m, drifting icebergs, and the towering...
 - **Iceberg & Wildlife Cruise** — South Greenland waters host icebergs calving from the Greenland ice sheet year-round, along with humpback whales, minke whales, and seabirds.
- **Hiking the Peaks Above Town** — Short hikes above Nanortalik reward with sweeping views of the harbour, offshore islands, and
- **Town Walk & Inuit Heritage** — Nanortalik's colourful wooden houses, the local church, and the small harbour quarter all reflect centuries of Danish colonial presence overlaid on...

BEST WALKS

- **Harbour to Open-Air Museum** ~1 km · 30 min · easy — From the tender landing, follow the waterfront to Nanortalik Museum's open-air village of turf houses and colonial buildings.
- **Viewpoint above town** ~2 km · 1–1.5 hrs · moderate — A rough trail climbs the hillside above the town for panoramic views over the harbour, the offshore islands, and the iceberg-dotted strait.

KNOW BEFORE YOU GO

- This is a tender port. There is no pier. Budget extra time for tender queues, especially on departure — missing the last tender is a real risk at remote ports.
- Icebergs are not guaranteed. Concentration varies by season and year. Summer (July–September) offers the best odds; earlier calls may see more ice in the fjord.
- Dress for Arctic variability. Even in summer, temperatures hover around 5–12 °C with sharp wind off the fjord. Waterproof layers, hat, and gloves are essential.
- Cash is king here. Nanortalik is a very small town. Card acceptance is limited; bring Danish Krone or small-denomination US dollars for local purchases and museum entry.
- Book Tasermiut Fjord through your ship or in advance. Local boat capacity is tiny. If Tasermiut is your priority, book a ship-organised excursion — independent tours can sell out or simply not be available.
- Connectivity is minimal. Mobile data is patchy and Wi-Fi nonexistent outside the ship. Download offline maps (maps.me covers Greenland) before you tender ashore.

- 1 Nanortalik Museum** Ten historic colonial-era buildings preserved as an open-air museum, with kayak, umiak, and Norse-clothing exhibits.

3 Qaqqarsuasik (Big Mountain) Peak rising directly behind town, climbed via a marked trail for panoramic views over Nanortalik's fjords and skerries.
- 2 Nanortalik Church** Charming wooden church near the old colonial harbour, a centerpiece of the preserved 19th-century townscape.
