GETTING ASHORE

Docking: Tender — ships anchor in bay; small expedition vessels may dock at the Atlantic Quay pier (60 m, 8 m depth)

Best For: Iceberg watching, Norse history, geology & rare minerals

Walk to center: 5–10 min uphill from tender dock

Don't Miss: Tugtupite gemstone hunt on Kvanefjeld slopes and the Narsaq Museum

Getting around: Taxi Varies (limited availability)

TOP THINGS TO DO

- Iceberg Safari by Zodiac** — Weave among blue-white giants calved from the glaciers of Sermilik Fjord.
 - Qassarsuk — Erik the Red's Brattahlíð** — A short boat ride across the fjord leads to the UNESCO World Heritage Site where Erik the Red farmed.
 - Twin Glaciers Boat Trip across Sermilik Fjord** — Cross the wide Sermilik Fjord among drifting icebergs to the Twin Glaciers
- (Tvillingebræen), passing bird cliffs and waterfalls.

 - Narsaq Museum & Historic Waterfront** — Housed in colonial-era buildings from the 1830s, the museum covers Norse and Inuit history, traditional kayaks, and the region's extraordinary...
 - Tugtupite Mineral Hunt on Kvanefjeld** — Join a local geological guide to search the slopes of Kvanefjeld for tugtupite — a rare pink stone found almost nowhere else on Earth.

BEST WALKS

- Town & Harbor Stroll** 1–2 km · 30–45 min · Easy — Walk from the harbor up through the colorful painted houses of the town center, past Narsaq Church (1927), and along the main street to the supermarket and local craft...
- Nuugaarsuk Peninsula (Narsaq Point)** 2–3 km · 1 hr · Easy — A 15-minute walk from the harbor leads to the Nuugaarsuk peninsula at the edge of town — the best spot in town to watch icebergs drift through the fjord with nothing...

KNOW BEFORE YOU GO

- Cards work at the main spots — Hotel Narsaq, the museum, and the supermarket all take Visa/Mastercard. Bring a little DKK cash for street vendors and the fish market.
- Bring insect repellent — summer midges and mosquitoes can be ferocious in the valleys and on hikes. A head net is useful on longer walks.
- Layers are essential — it can be warm and sunny in town (15–20°C in July/August) but very cold on the tender or near icebergs. Wear wicking base layers and bring a windproof shell.
- Connectivity is limited — Greenland's internet is satellite-based, slow, and expensive. Turn off cellular data roaming before going ashore to avoid large charges.
- Never climb on grounded icebergs — small 'growlers' wash ashore on Narsaq's black sand beaches. They look stable but can roll without warning.
- CITES rules for souvenirs — seal skin, muskox horn, or whale bone products require a CITES certificate for import back to the EU, US, or Canada. Tugtupite jewelry is exempt and makes the ideal souvenir.
