**Docking:** Manhattan Cruise Terminal (Piers 88–92) or Brooklyn Cruise Terminal (Red Hook)

**Walk to center:** 15-min walk or quick subway from Midtown pier; Red Hook requires taxi/rideshare (~20 min)

**Best For:** First-timers, culture lovers, foodies, shoppers

**Don't Miss:** Statue of Liberty ferry, Central Park, the High Line

## TOP THINGS TO DO

- **Statue of Liberty & Ellis Island** — The quintessential New York experience.
- **Metropolitan Museum of Art** — One of the world's greatest art collections, spanning 5,000 years of human creativity.
- **Central Park Walking Tour** — 843 acres of urban parkland with Bethesda Fountain, the Bow Bridge, Belvedere Castle, and Strawberry Fields.
- **9/11 Memorial & Museum** — A moving tribute at the site of the World Trade Center.
- **The High Line & Chelsea Market** — A 1.45-mile elevated park built on a disused rail line above the streets of West Chelsea.

## BEST WALKS

- **Midtown Highlights Walk** 3–4 km · 1.5–2 hrs · Easy — From the cruise terminal, walk east to Times Square, south on 7th Ave to Bryant Park and the New York Public Library, then east to...
- **Lower Manhattan & Brooklyn Bridge** 4–5 km · 2–2.5 hrs · Easy — Take the subway from the pier down to Fulton Street.

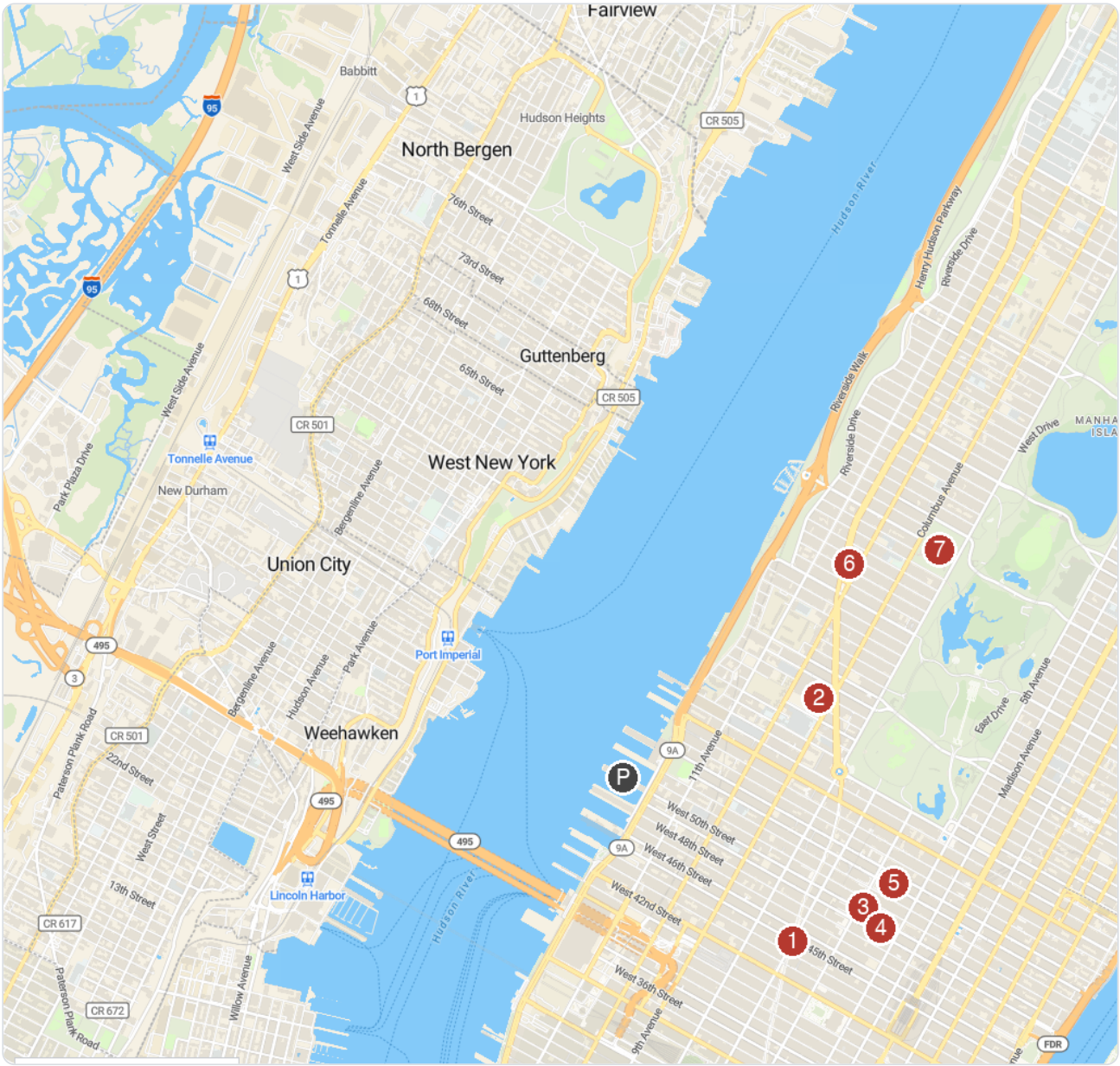
## KNOW BEFORE YOU GO

- Subway is king. A single MetroCard tap gets you anywhere in the five boroughs. Tap with a credit/debit card or Apple/Google Pay — no need to buy a card for short visits.
- Book Statue of Liberty tickets weeks ahead. Same-day tickets often sell out. Crown access requires reservations months in advance.
- Eat like a New Yorker. Dollar slice pizza joints are everywhere in Midtown. Joe's Pizza (7 Carmine St, West Village) is a classic.
