TOP THINGS TO DO

- **Beechey Island — Franklin Expedition Graves** — Land on the windswept island where three of Franklin's men were buried in 1846.
- **Pond Inlet — Inuit Cultural Performance** — In this Baffin Island community, local performers share traditional drum dancing, Inuit games, and hauntingly beautiful throat singing at the...
- **Zodiac Wildlife Cruise** — Cruise among icebergs and along rocky shores searching for polar bears, narwhals, beluga whales, walrus, muskoxen, and Arctic seabirds.
- **Gjoa Haven — Amundsen Overwintering Site** — Walk the community where Roald Amundsen spent two winters (1903–05) learning Arctic survival from the Netsilik Inuit — the knowledge that made his...
- **Polar Plunge** — Jump into the Arctic Ocean from a Zodiac platform or gravel shore, tethered to a safety line.

BEST WALKS

- **Cambridge Bay Town Walk** Easy · 1–2 km · 30–60 min — Walk from the community dock past the Canadian High Arctic Research Station (CHARS) and the local Northern Store (check the fly-in food prices).
- **Pond Inlet & Eclipse Sound Views** Easy · 1 km · 30 min — From the dock, walk to the Nattinnak Visitor Centre for wildlife and cultural exhibits, then stroll toward the Sound for views of Bylot Island.

KNOW BEFORE YOU GO

- Layer obsessively. Temps range 0–10°C but Zodiac wind chill bites hard. Wool base layer, fleece mid-layer, waterproof shell — plus waterproof pants and knee-high rubber boots.
- Protect your gear. Saltwater Zodiac spray destroys cameras and phones. Use a waterproof dry bag until you're safely ashore.
- Bring a bug net. In August the tundra can swarm with blackflies and mosquitoes. A head net and strong repellent are essential for wilderness landings.
- Buy Inuit art directly. Soapstone carvings, qiviut (muskox wool) knitwear, and prints support local artists directly. Ask if it's handmade before buying.
- Ask before photographing people. Always get permission before taking photos of community members, especially children. It matters.
- Midnight sun is real. Expect 20+ hours of daylight in August. Blackout curtains in your cabin help — and late-night Zodiac wildlife cruises are surreal.
