TOP THINGS TO DO

- **Oarai Isosaki Shrine & Kamiiso Torii Gate** — The ancient Shinto shrine (founded 856 AD) crowns a headland above the Pacific, but the real drama is the white torii...
- **Aqua World Oarai Aquarium** — One of Japan's largest aquariums, housing over 580 species including 60+ shark species — the most in Japan.
- **Oarai Seafood Market & Kaisen-don** — The Oarai Kaisen Ichiba seafood market near the port is the place for fresh oysters, grilled clams, and bowls piled...
- **Mentai Park Oarai** — A free theme park dedicated to mentaiko (spicy cod roe) run by Kanefuku, one of Japan's top producers.
- **Mito City Day Trip — Kairakuen Garden & Mito Castle** — A 15-minute train ride from Oarai brings you to Mito, home to Kairakuen — one of Japan's Three Great Gardens — and the...

BEST WALKS

- **Pier to Seaside Station & Mentai Park Loop** ~2 km | 30-40 min | Easy | Flat — A gentle flat walk through the port area, past the Marine Tower observation deck, into the Oarai Seaside Station open-air mall, and...
- **Isosaki Shrine & Torii Gate Walk** ~3 km one way | 30-35 min | Moderate | Stairs at shrine — Follow the coastal road north from the port to Oarai Isosaki Shrine.

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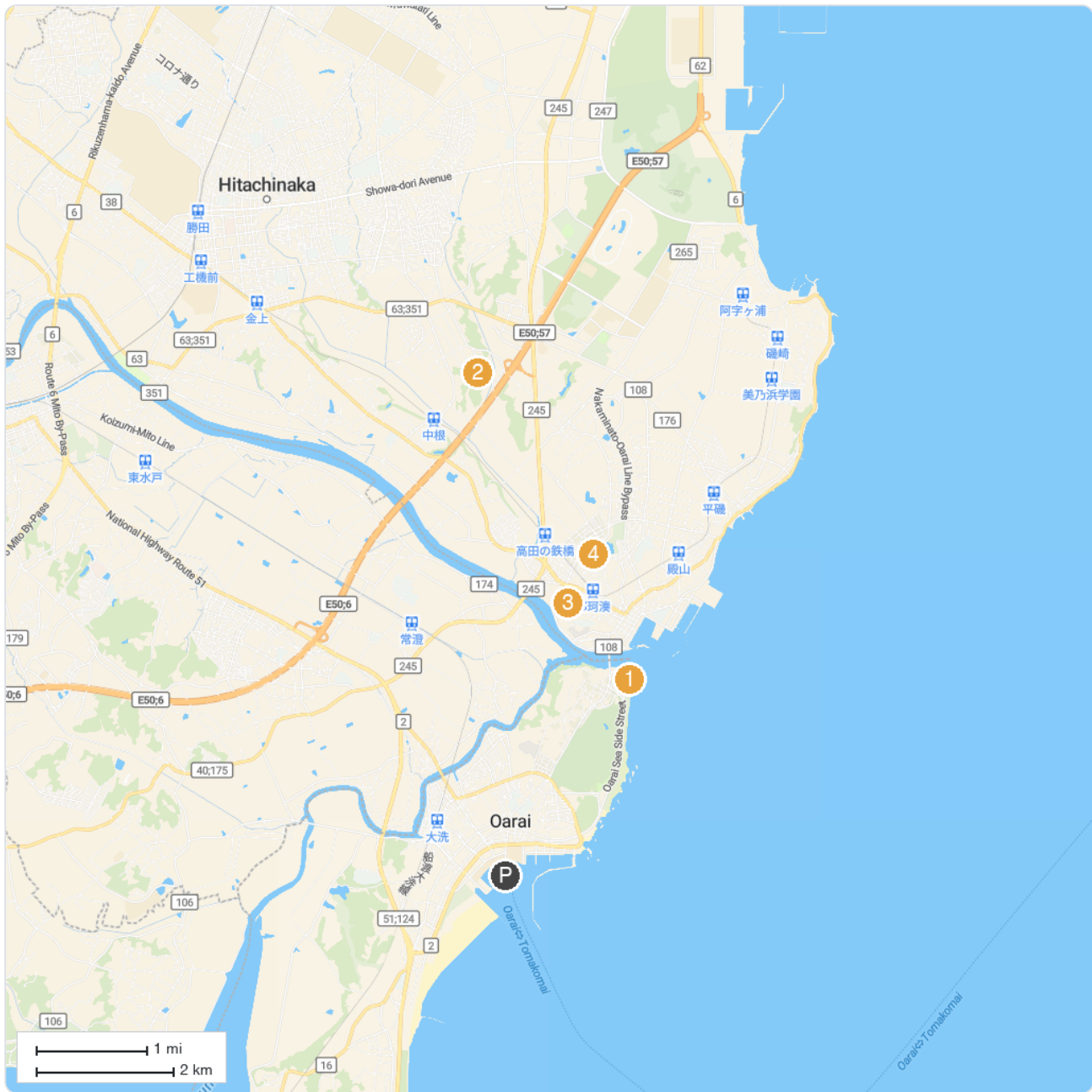
KNOW BEFORE YOU GO
