- **Two Dollar Beach (Avaio Beach)** — Despite the name, entry is \$5 USD.
- **Tisa's Barefoot Bar — Beach Lunch** — A legendary South Pacific beach bar at Alega Beach.
- **Island Scenic Tour — Aiga Bus or Taxi** — Circle Tutuila's stunning coastline past villages, through the National Park, and to Fatu-ma-Futi (Flowerpot Rock), the...

BEST WALKS

- **Fagatogo Waterfront Loop** 30–45 min · Flat · Free — From the Multiuse Wharf, walk along the harbor road past the Fagatogo Market, the Historic District, and the Jean P.
- **Utulei Beach Stroll** 15 min each way · Flat · Free — Walk west along the harbor road to Utulei beach and Sadie's by the Sea.

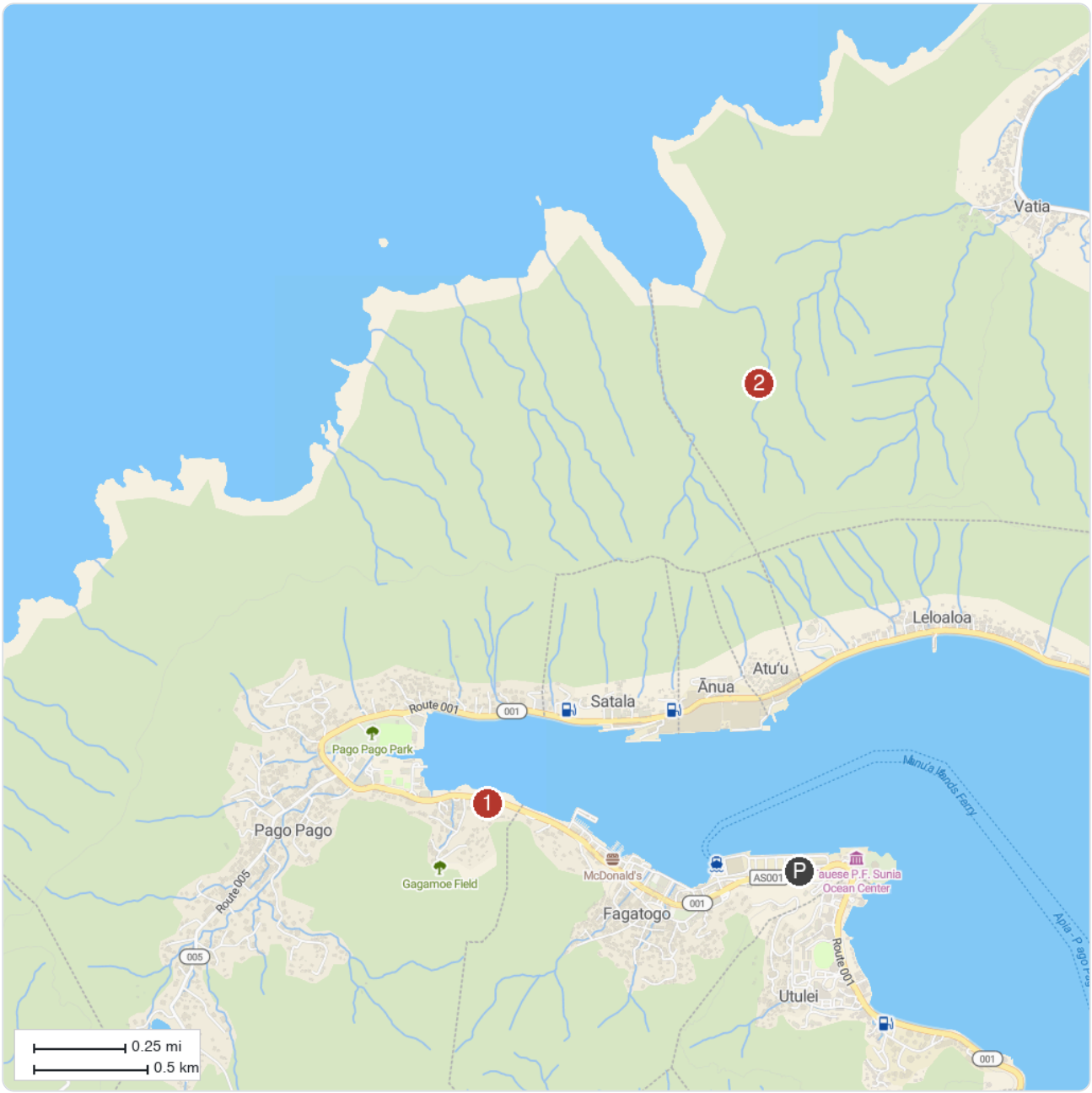
KNOW BEFORE YOU GO

- Rainmaker Mountain is real: Mount Pioa traps passing clouds — sudden tropical downpours are common. Bring a compact poncho or umbrella; it typically clears in 10–15 minutes.
- The tuna smell: Starkist operates one of the world's largest tuna canneries in the harbor. Depending on wind direction, you'll smell it. Locals call it 'the smell of money.'
- Bring small USD cash: American Samoa uses US dollars. Cards are accepted at resorts but not at markets, aiga buses, or beach entry points. Small bills (\$1, \$5) are essential.
