TOP THINGS TO DO

- **Corralejo Dunes National Park** — Vast golden dunes meeting brilliant turquoise water in a protected natural park.
- **Windsurfing & Kitesurfing Lessons** — Fuerteventura is a world-class wind-sports destination.
- **Betancuria & Island Drive** — The ancient capital of Fuerteventura sits in a dramatic mountain valley.
- **Dolphin & Whale Watching** — Boat trips from Puerto del Rosario or Corralejo offer reliable dolphin sightings; pilot whales and loggerhead turtles...
- **Playa Blanca Beach Day** — A 2 km walk south along the coastal promenade from the port, Playa Blanca is a wide, calm beach with a beach bar...

BEST WALKS

- **Waterfront Sculpture Trail** 1.5 km · 30-45 min · Flat & paved — From the cruise terminal, walk north along the promenade past the whale skeleton sculpture and into the city center.
- **Coastal Path to Playa Blanca** 2 km · 25 min · Easy coastal walk — Head south from the port along the coastal promenade past lime kilns and more sculptures.

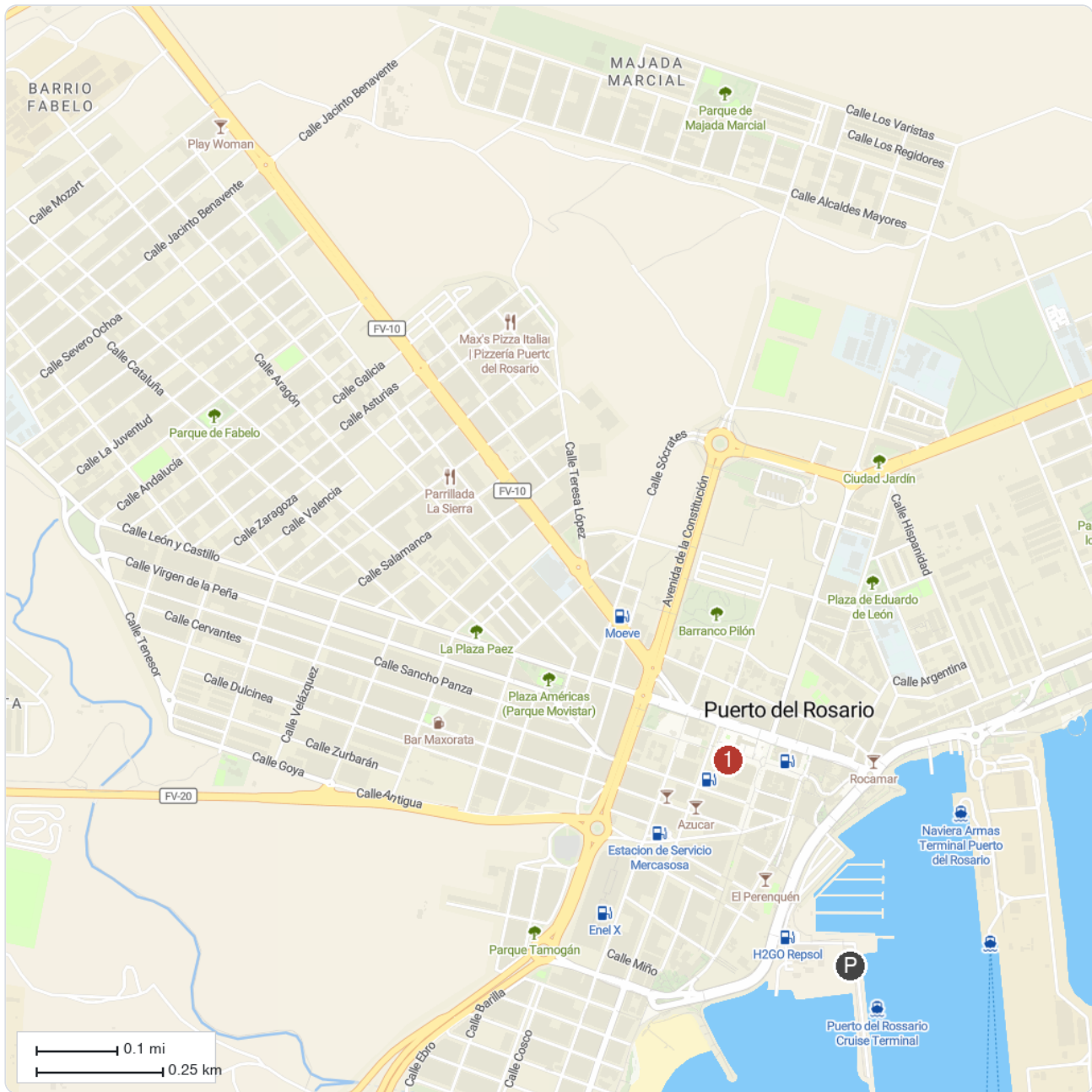
KNOW BEFORE YOU GO

- Wind is constant. Fuerteventura means 'strong winds' — always bring a light windbreaker and secure your hat, even in summer.
- Rent a car at the port. Cicar and Autoreisen have desks near the terminal. With a car you can reach Corralejo dunes, Betancuria, and the west coast in one day.
- Siesta warning. Independent shops and museums close 1:30-5:00 PM. The Las Rotondas mall and waterfront restaurants stay
