- **Vatican & St. Peter's Basilica** — The Vatican Museums, Sistine Chapel, and St. Peter's Basilica (now ticketed), Piazza Navona...
- **Colosseum, Roman Forum & Palatine Hill** — The Roman Empire's greatest amphitheatre and the forum below it are covered on a single combo ticket.
- **Trastevere food & neighbourhood walk** — Rome's most atmospheric medieval neighbourhood across the Tiber — cobblestone lanes, trattorias, and the beautiful...
- **Trevi Fountain, Pantheon & Piazzas** — A walking loop through central Rome: Trevi Fountain, the perfectly preserved Pantheon, and the Piazza Navona.
- **Stay in Civitavecchia** — If Rome fatigue is real, Civitavecchia has a pleasant old town, the Forte Michelangelo (a Bramante-designed fortress on...

BEST WALKS

- **Vatican to Trastevere** ~3.5 km · 2–3 hrs · mostly flat — From St. Peter's Basilica to the Trastevere district.
- **Colosseum to Trevi Fountain** ~4 km · 2–3 hrs · mostly flat — From the Colosseum, walk north past the Imperial Fora, through the neighbourhood of Monti, up to the Trevi Fountain and Pantheon.

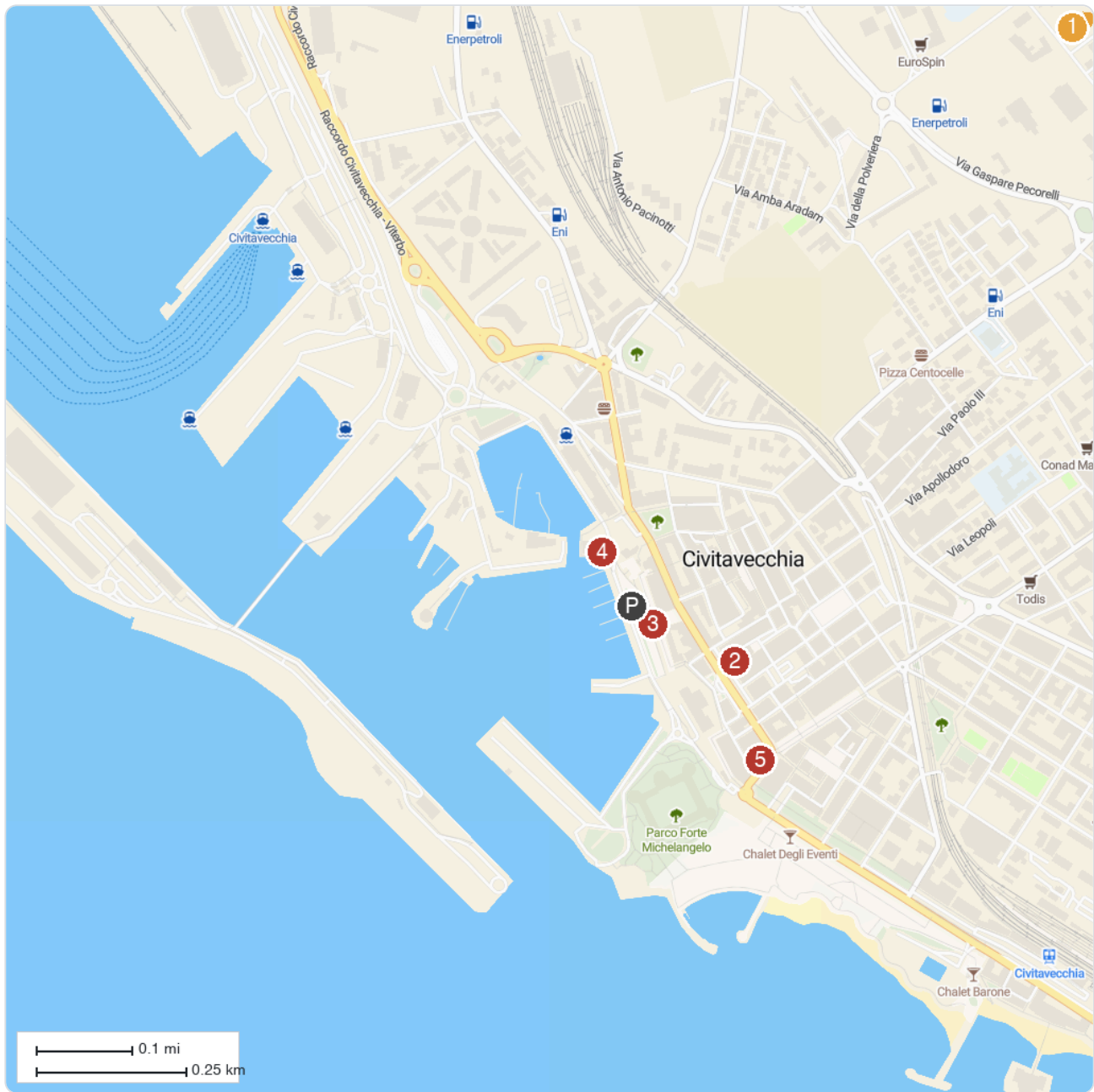
KNOW BEFORE YOU GO

- The Trenitalia regional train is the best way to Rome. Cheap (€8–10), frequent, and you arrive at Roma Termini with the metro at your feet. Buy tickets at machines to avoid queues.
- Pre-book the Colosseum and Vatican Museums before your cruise. Walk-up queues routinely eat 1–2 hours in summer. Both sell out. Use coopculture.it and museivaticani.va.
- St. Peter's Basilica is free — skip the queue with the Papal Audience entrance on the left side of the square. Dress code: covered

5 **Museo Archeologico Nazionale di Civitavecchia** National museum displaying ancient Roman artifacts from the region.

2 **Cattedrale di S. Francesco d'Assisi**

Civitavecchia's main cathedral, dedicated to Saint Francis of Assisi.

4 **Ancient Fortress of Civitavecchia**

Historic port fortress, also known as Forte Michelangelo.
