- **Pelourinho Walking Tour** — The UNESCO-listed colonial heart — pastel mansions, the gilded São Francisco church (one of Brazil's most opulent)...
- **Bonfim Church & Ribbons** — The Igreja do Bonfim, Bahia's most beloved church, famous for its colorful wish-ribbons (fitas) and a fusion of...
- **Farol da Barra & Beaches** — The lighthouse at Barra guarding the bay mouth, with a nautical museum and the city's most popular urban beaches for a...
- **Acarajé & Bahian Food Tasting** — Sample acarajé — the black-eyed-pea fritters fried in dendê palm oil by white-clad baianas — plus moqueca stew and...

BEST WALKS

- **Pelourinho old town** ~2 km · 1.5 hrs · easy (hilly) — From Praça da Sé through the Terreiro de Jesus and down the postcard slope of Largo do Pelourinho, past the gilded São Francisco...
- **Mercado Modelo & Lower City** ~1 km · 1 hr · easy — The handicraft market in the old customs house by the port — Bahian crafts, music, and capoeira — a quick stop before riding the...
- **Farol da Barra waterfront** ~2 km · 1 hr · easy — The promenade around the Barra lighthouse where the bay meets the Atlantic — sunsets, sea breeze, and the maritime museum.

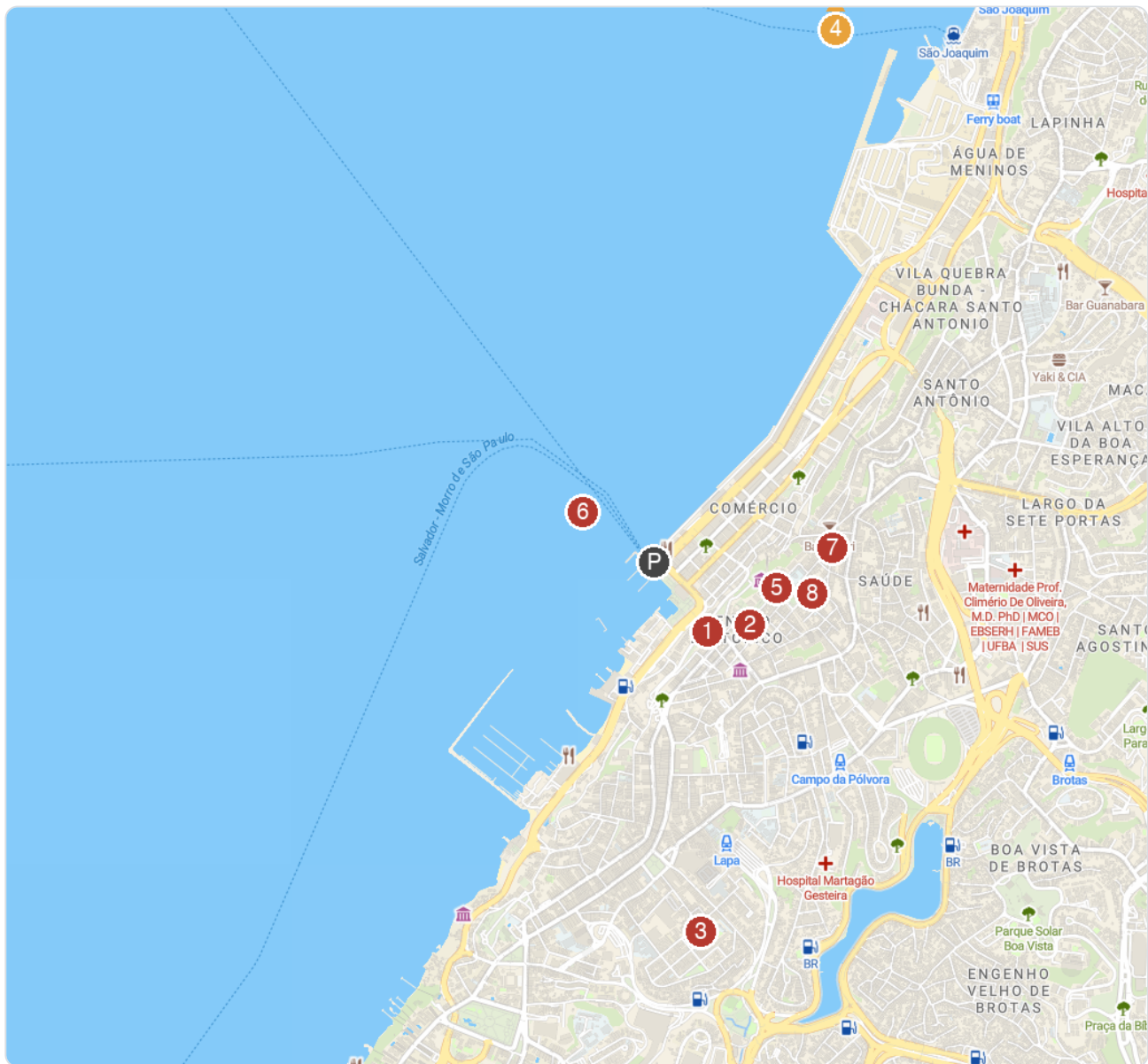
KNOW BEFORE YOU GO

- Ride the Elevador Lacerda. The historic Art Deco lift connects the Lower City port to the Pelourinho for pennies — skip the steep, sketchy stairs.
- Try acarajé. The baianas' black-eyed-pea fritters with shrimp and spicy vatapá are Salvador's iconic street food — a must.
- Stay street-smart. Salvador is wonderful but has petty crime — keep cameras and phones low-key, stick to busy areas, and

- 1 Elevador Lacerda** Historic art deco public elevator connecting Salvador's upper and lower cities.
- 3 Space Xisto Bahia** A vibrant cultural space for art, music, and events.
- 5 Cathedral of Salvador** Salvador's grand Jesuit cathedral, a stunning example of Baroque architecture.
- 7 Museu da Gastronomia Baiana** A museum celebrating the rich history of Bahian cuisine.
- P Cruise port / terminal**

- 2 Prefeitura Bairro Centro/Brotas** A municipal administrative office, not a tourist attraction.
- 4 Basílica do Senhor do Bonfim** Iconic church famous for its colorful ribbons and religious syncretism.
- 6 São Marcelo Fort** A unique circular 17th-century fort in Salvador's bay.
- 8 MuNEAN- National Museum of Nursing Anna Nery** Museum dedicated to the history of Brazilian nursing, honoring Anna Nery.
