- **Tayrona National Park** — The crown jewel of the Colombian Caribbean — a UNESCO-protected mosaic of jungle, coral reef, and turquoise coves where...
- **Minca Cloud Forest & Waterfalls** — A 45-minute drive into the foothills of the Sierra Nevada brings you to the village of Minca, surrounded by coffee...
- **Quinta de San Pedro Alejandrino** — The colonial hacienda on the outskirts of Santa Marta where Simón Bolívar, Liberator of South America, spent his final...
- **Historic Centre & Taganga Village** — Walk the cobblestone streets of Colombia's oldest city — the Catedral de Santa Marta (one of South America's oldest)...

BEST WALKS

- **Port to Parque de los Novios & the Cathedral** ~1.5 km · 45 min · easy — Head straight from the pier along Calle 10 into the historic centre.
- **Simón Bolívar statues & Malecón waterfront** ~2 km · 1 hr · easy — Follow the renovated Malecón waterfront promenade past the Estatua de Simón Bolívar and the old customs house.
- **El Rodadero Beach** ~3 km by taxi · 2 hrs · easy — A short taxi ride south of the port brings you to El Rodadero, Santa Marta's most popular beach resort area.

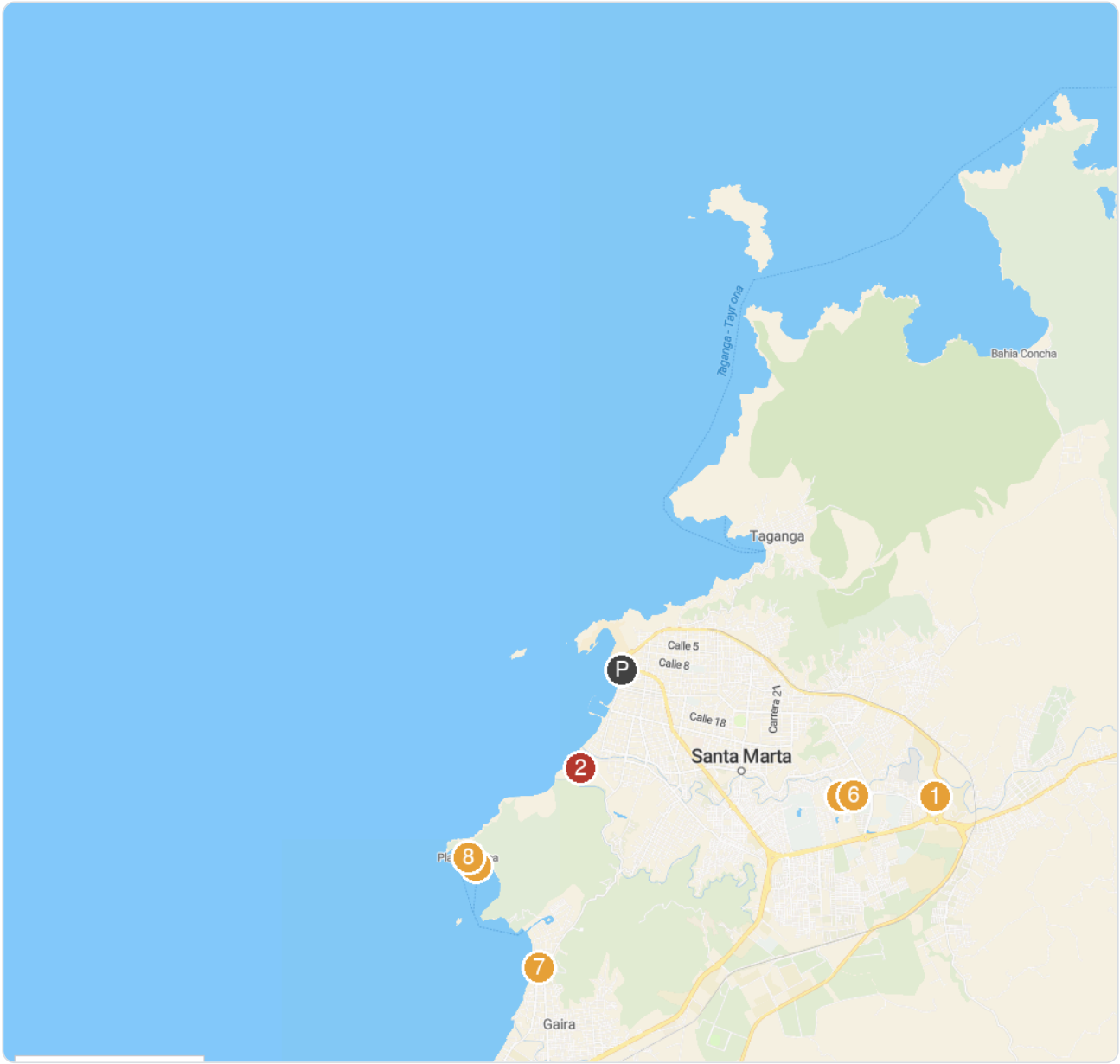
KNOW BEFORE YOU GO

- Carry small bills in pesos. USD is rarely accepted outside big hotels. ATMs are available in the city centre — withdraw COP pesos for taxis, street food, and park entry fees.
- Sunscreen and insect repellent are non-negotiable. The Caribbean heat is intense year-round and Tayrona's jungle paths bring mosquitoes — apply both before you leave the ship.
