TOP THINGS TO DO

- Sitka National Historical Park** — The oldest national park in Alaska.
- Alaska Raptor Center** — A working rehabilitation center for injured bald eagles, owls, and hawks — some permanently resident because they can't be released.
- Fortress of the Bear** — A nonprofit bear sanctuary housing orphaned brown bears rescued from the wild.
- St. Michael's Cathedral & Russian Heritage** — The onion-domed cathedral at the center of downtown is the oldest Russian Orthodox church in North America (rebuilt after a 1966 fire, with original...
- Sea Otter & Wildlife Quest** — Sitka Sound is one of the best places in Alaska to see sea otters, Steller sea lions, humpback whales, and seabirds from a small boat.

BEST WALKS

- Downtown Heritage Loop** ~2 km · 1–1.5 hrs · easy — From the small boat harbor, walk Lincoln Street past St.
- Indian River Trail to Sitka National Historical Park** ~3.5 km one-way · 1.5–2 hrs · easy-moderate — Walk or cab to the park entrance, then follow the totem-lined forest trail along the Indian River to the 1804 battle site.

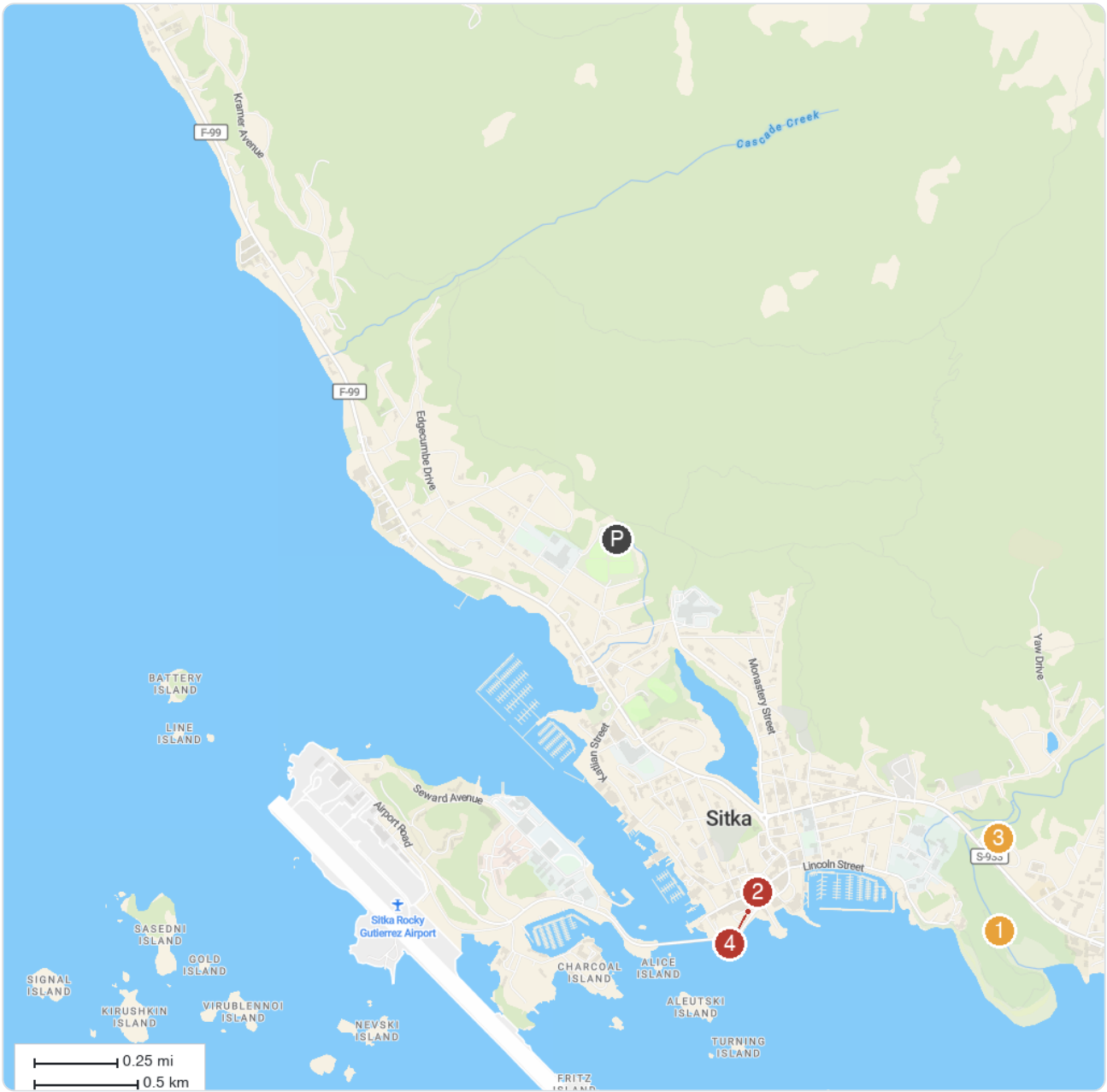
KNOW BEFORE YOU GO

- Sitka is wetter than Juneau — pack waterproof layers even if the ship says partly cloudy. Rain can arrive fast on the outer coast.
- The Raptor Center is worth the admission. It's a working rehab facility, not a zoo — the close-up bald eagle encounters are genuinely rare.
- Sitka National Historical Park is free and just 1 mile from downtown. The totem trail through the old-growth forest is one of the finest short walks in all of Alaska.
- Fortress of the Bear is about 5–6 miles out on Sawmill Creek Road — too far to walk. Book a tour that includes it, or share a cab with fellow passengers.
- It's the USA — USD, English, no currency hassle. Sitka is a small town; ATMs are limited, so bring some cash for smaller vendors and cab tips.
- Check your tender or shuttle schedule carefully. The last tender back can be earlier than you expect — missing it on a tendered call means hiring a water taxi at your own expense.

Sitka National Historical Park

A coastal rainforest park with a totem pole trail and the 1804 battle site between Tlingit warriors and Russian forces.

St. Michael's Cathedral

A Russian Orthodox cathedral in the town center, rebuilt after an 1966 fire using original icons saved by residents.
- 3

Alaska Raptor Center

A rehabilitation center for injured bald eagles and other raptors, with a flight-training center visitors can view.
- 4

Castle Hill

A hilltop park where Alaska formally transferred from Russia to the United States in 1867, with harbor views.
