- **St. Lawrence Market & Kensington Market** — National Geographic's world's best food market has been feeding Torontonians since 1803.
- **Toronto Islands Ferry & Skyline Views** — A 10-minute ferry from the Jack Layton Ferry Terminal whisks you to a chain of car-free islands.
- **Royal Ontario Museum (ROM)** — Canada's largest museum of world culture and natural history, housed in a striking building featuring 'The Crystal' — a...

BEST WALKS

- **Waterfront to Distillery District** 2.5 km · Easy · ~45 min — Start at the Harbourfront Centre, walk east along Queens Quay, pass Sugar Beach, and arrive at the Victorian brick lanes of the...
- **Downtown Core: CN Tower to St. Lawrence Market** 2 km · Easy · ~40 min — Begin at the CN Tower and Ripley's Aquarium, walk east past Union Station and the St.
- **Kensington Market & Chinatown** 1.5 km loop · Easy · ~1 hr — Explore bohemian Kensington Market's vintage stores and global food stalls, then spill into Chinatown along Spadina Avenue.

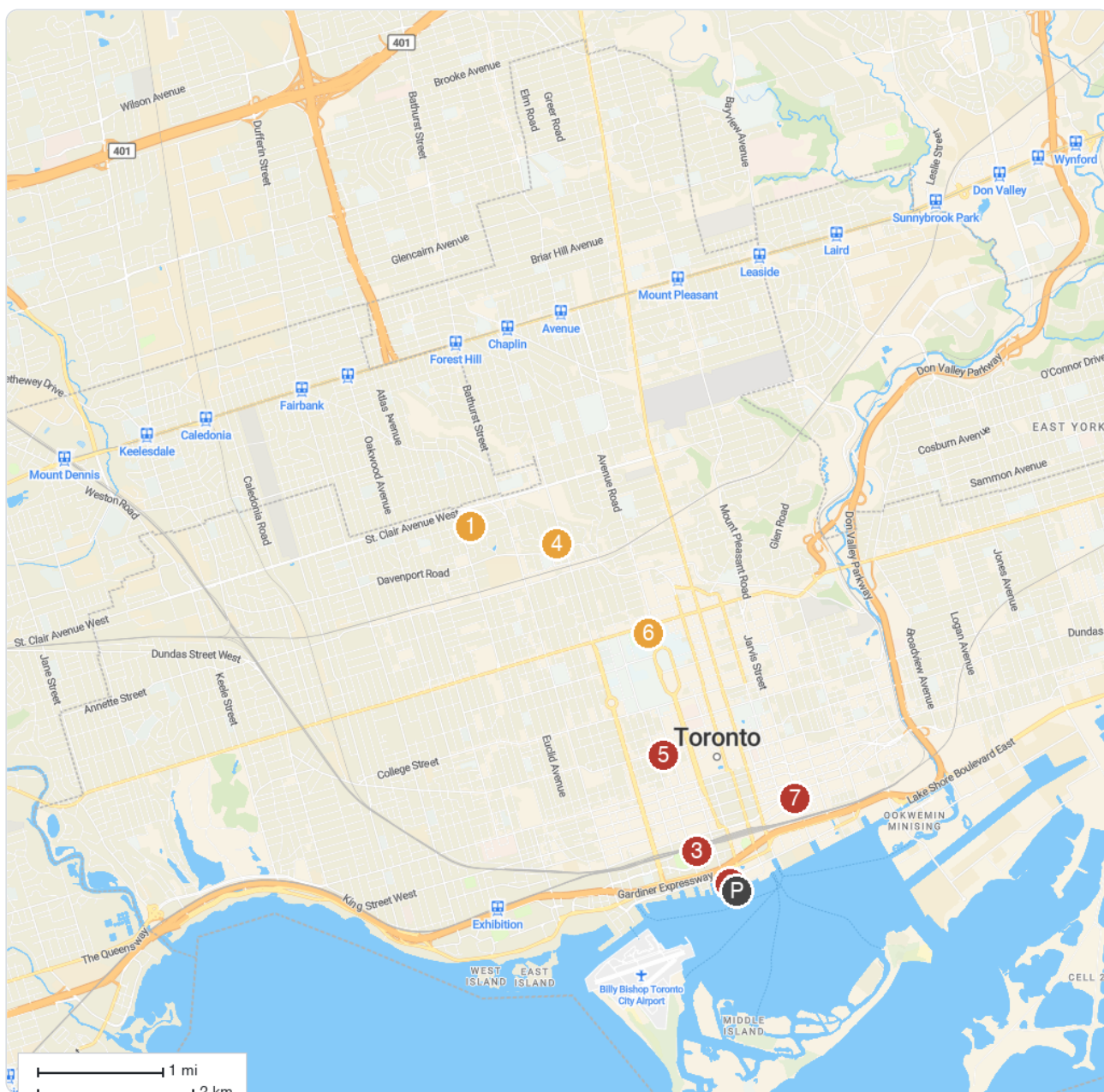
