GETTING ASHORE

Docking: Tender / wet landing — ships anchor offshore; no pier on island

Best For: Beach days, snorkeling, wildlife spotting, diving sunken wrecks

Walk to Center: 0 min — beach is the destination; everything within 5-min walk on sand

Don't Miss: Shipwreck scuba dives — Costa Rica's only Pacific-coast wrecks are here

TOP THINGS TO DO

- Beach Day on the Main White-Sand Beach** — The main beach is pure vacation fantasy: soft white sand, calm warm water, coconut palms, and a thatch-roofed bar serving Coco Locos and Imperial beer.
- Snorkeling Around the Rock Formations** — The best snorkeling is off the volcanic rock outcroppings just offshore.
- Scuba Diving the Sunken Shipwrecks** — The waters off Tortuga Island hold several deliberately sunken shipwrecks — including the Franklin Chang Díaz (a former Coast Guard vessel sunk in...
- Kayak & Stand-Up Paddleboard** — The sheltered, glassy water makes this one of Costa Rica's best spots for paddling.
- Island Wildlife Walk** — Green iguanas, tropical birds, and coatis roam freely, and white-faced capuchin monkeys are sometimes seen.

BEST WALKS

- Beach Stroll — Main White-Sand Beach** ~500m · Flat · 10 min · Easy — Walk the length of the main white-sand beach from the tender landing to the far end.
- Forest Hill Trail** ~1 km · Steep · 30–45 min · Moderate — A trail heads uphill from the beach into dry tropical forest with views over the Gulf of Nicoya.

KNOW BEFORE YOU GO

- Wear water shoes. The tender landing is a wet landing — you'll step into shin-deep water. Flip-flops work but water shoes are better for the rocky snorkel areas too.
- Bring small USD bills. The beach bar and activity rentals accept dollars. Vendors often can't make change for \$50s or \$100s.
- Guard your bag. Coatis (raccoon-like animals) are bold thieves. Keep bags zipped and don't leave food unattended on the sand.
- Reef-safe sunscreen only. The island is a protected nature reserve. Bring reef-safe SPF — regular sunscreen is harmful to the coral and may be prohibited.
- Restrooms cost ~\$1–2 USD. Basic facilities are on the island but there's usually a small maintenance fee. Keep coins or small bills handy.
- Try a Coco Loco. A fresh coconut with guaro (Costa Rican sugarcane spirit) or rum poured in — the island's signature drink, sold at the beach bar.
