

Uummannaq, West Greenland, Greenland

Rising 1,170 metres above a fjord choked with cathedral-sized icebergs, Uummannaq's heart-shaped mountain gives this tiny island town its name — and a reason to feel like you've reached the edge of the world.

GETTING ASHORE

Docking: Ships anchor offshore; all passengers come ashore by tender or Zodiac

Best For: Iceberg scenery, Inuit culture, remote Arctic atmosphere

Walk to center: Landing area is the town harbor — church, museum and main street within 5–10 min

Don't Miss: Uummannaq Museum (1880 hospital) and the view of the heart-shaped mountain from the harbor

 Getting around:  Taxi  ~30–50 DKK (short trips) ·  Rideshare  not available

TOP THINGS TO DO

- Iceberg Boat Tour — Uummannaq Fjord** — Sail among cathedral-sized icebergs calved from nearby glaciers, including the fast-moving Qarajaq glacier.
- Uummannaq Museum** — Housed in Greenland's oldest surviving hospital building (1880), this excellent small museum covers the Qilakitsoq mummies, Alfred Wegener's 1930–31...
- Town Walk — Church, Santa's Office & Earthen Houses** — Explore Uummannaq's compact center: the 1935 stone church built from local granite boulders (Greenland's only stone church), the colorful wooden...
- Hike to Santa's Cabin & Mountain Views** — A manageable marked trail leads up from town past mountain lakes to a small cabin with panoramic views of the fjord, icebergs, and the heart-shaped...
- Qilakitsoq Archaeological Site Boat Trip** — A longer boat excursion to the Qilakitsoq cliffs on the far side of the fjord, where eight Inuit mummies dating to around 1475 AD were discovered in...

BEST WALKS

- Harbor to Stone Church Loop** 1.5 km · 25 min · Easy — From the harbor quay, walk up the main street past colorful wooden homes and the old doctor's house to the 1935 granite stone church.
- Trail to the Mountain Viewpoint** 3–4 km return · 1.5 hrs · Moderate — A marked trail from the edge of town climbs past a small mountain lake toward Santa's Cabin.

KNOW BEFORE YOU GO

- Dress in layers. Summer temperatures are 5–10°C with strong wind chill, and Zodiac landings spray cold water. Waterproof jacket, gloves, and warm base layer are essential.
- Bring Danish Krone (DKK) cash. Card payment works at the museum and some shops, but cash is safer for small purchases and local crafts.
- Tender schedule is weather-dependent. Arctic swells can delay or shorten tender operations. Check your ship's daily program and don't cut the return time close.
- The mountain view is best from the harbor. The heart-shaped Uummannaq Mountain (1,170 m) is most dramatic from the quay and the football field — you don't need to hike for the classic shot.
- Uummannaq is genuinely remote. There are no tourist shops in the Western sense, no bars, and very limited dining. Eat on the ship and treat the town as a cultural walk, not a shopping stop.
- Book fjord boat tours early. The local operator Uummannaq Sea Safaris has limited capacity. Reserve through your ship's excursion desk or ask the captain's office the evening before arrival.
