GETTING ASHORE

Docking: Anchor & tender to Virgin Gorda Yacht Harbour, Spanish Town

Walk to center: 2-5 min from tender dock to Spanish Town shops & restaurants

Best For: The Baths, snorkeling, uncrowded beaches, yachting atmosphere

Don't Miss: The Baths National Park boulder trail to Devil's Bay

TOP THINGS TO DO

- **The Baths National Park** — Navigate a maze of house-sized granite boulders forming sea caves, tunnels, and tidal pools leading to the secluded...
- **Spring Bay & Devil's Bay** — Just north of The Baths, Spring Bay has the same dramatic boulders with far fewer crowds.
- **Savannah Bay** — A long, sweeping crescent of white sand on the island's northern side — often virtually empty.
- **Gorda Peak National Park Hike** — Hike through semi-rainforest to the island's 1,370-ft summit observation tower for 360° views across the BVI, including...
- **Copper Mine Point Ruins** — Walk the dramatic windswept southern tip to see ruins of a 19th-century Cornish copper mine — engine house, chimney...

BEST WALKS

- **Spanish Town Stroll** 30-45 min · Easy · Flat — Wander the yacht harbor, browse boutique shops, and stop for conch fritters or a rum punch at The Bath & Turtle.
- **The Baths Trail to Devil's Bay** 45-60 min · Moderate · Water shoes required — From the Baths entrance, follow marked trail signs through the granite boulder labyrinth — ducking under overhangs, climbing short...

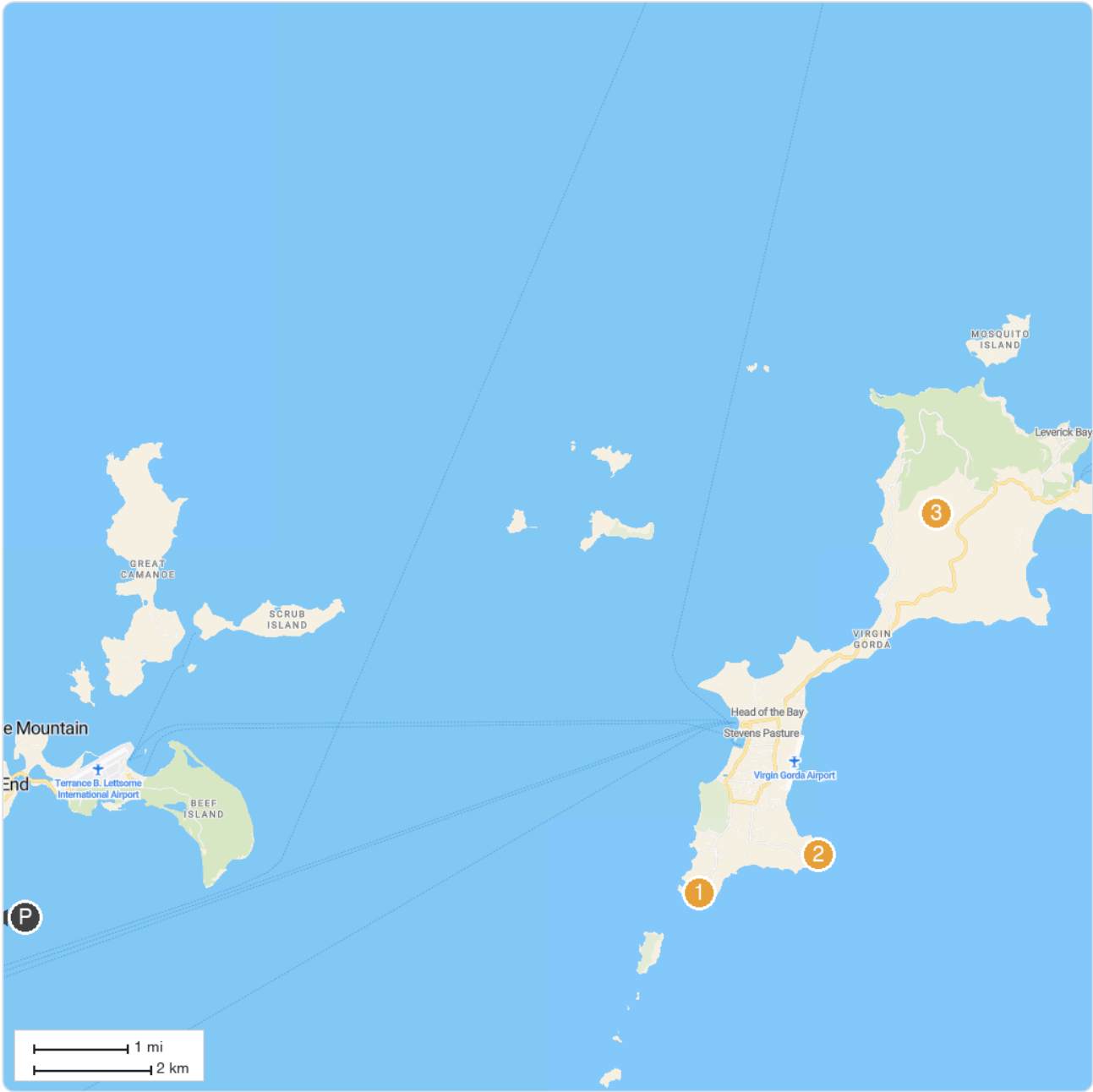
KNOW BEFORE YOU GO

- Wear water shoes to The Baths. The granite boulders and cave floors are extremely slippery. Flip-flops are not adequate.
- Bring a dry bag. You'll need both hands free to climb ladders and grab ropes in the caves — don't try it with a handbag or open backpack.
- Check tender cutoff times. Tender queues build in the afternoon. Aim to be back at the Yacht Harbour at least 45 minutes before all-aboard.
