TOP THINGS TO DO

- Colonial Williamsburg** — The world's largest living history museum spans 301 acres of restored 18th-century Virginia.
- Yorktown Battlefield & NPS Visitor Center** — Walk the very ground where Cornwallis surrendered to Washington in 1781, ending the Revolutionary War.
- American Revolution Museum at Yorktown** — State-of-the-art museum with immersive holographic theater, a re-created Continental Army encampment, and a...
- Jamestown Settlement** — America's first permanent English settlement (1607) lies 15 miles from Yorktown.
- Yorktown Beach & Riverwalk** — A calm, sandy beach on the York River is steps from the pier.

BEST WALKS

- Riverwalk to Historic Main Street** ~0.6 mi | 15 min | Moderate (uphill) — Stroll from the pier along the York River, then climb up to Main Street to see 18th-century homes still bearing British cannonball...
- Colonial Williamsburg Duke of Gloucester Street** ~0.75 mi end-to-end | Easy | Flat brick/gravel — The main spine of Colonial Williamsburg runs from the Capitol building through the historic district to Merchants Square and the...

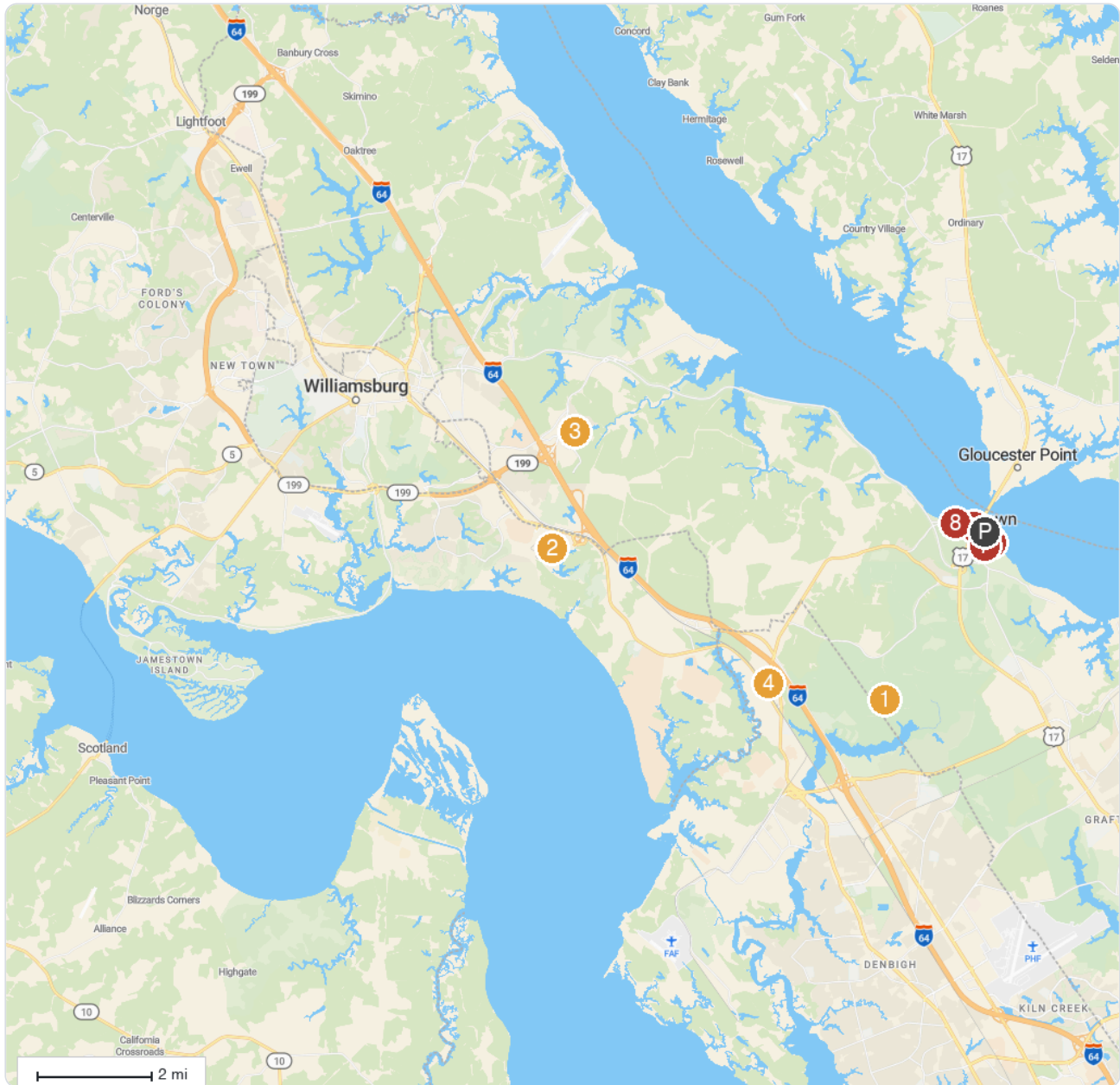
KNOW BEFORE YOU GO
